Be it Resolved by the Legistature of the State of Texas:

SECTION 1. That Section 33 of Article 16 of the Constitution of the State of Texas be amend ed so as to read as follows:

'The accounting officers of this State shall peither draw nor pay a warrent upon the for such ame adment shall be have printed on their ballot the Treasury in favor of any person, for salary or compensation as ent, officer or appointee, who holds at the same time any other office or position of honor, trust or profit, under this State or the United States; except as prescribed in this Constitution. Provided, that this restriction as to the drawing and paying of warrants upon the Treasury shall not apply to officers of the National Guard of Texas, the National Guard Reserve, the Officers Reserve Corps of the United States, nor to enlisted men of the National Guard, the National Guard Reserve, and the Organized Reserves of the United States."

SECTION 2. That Section 40 of Article 16 of the Constingtion of the State of Texas the amended so as to read as folloy s:

"No person shall hold or exercise, at the same time, wore than one civil office of emolument, except that of Justice of the Peace, County Commissioner, Notary Public and Postmaster, officer of the National Guard, the National Guard Reserve, and the Omcers Reserve Corps of the United States, and enlisted men of the National Guard. the National Guard Reserve, and the Organized Reserves of

PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION.

SENATE JOINT RESOLU-TION NO. 9

A Joint Resolution relating to the amending of Article 16, Section 58, of the Constitution of the State of Texas, abolish ing the Board of Prison Commissioners; providing for the supervision and mangement of the Prison System, under such laws as may be provided for by the Legislature.

Be it Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Texas SECTION 1. That Article 16, Section 58 of the Constitution of the State of Texas, be amended so as to hereafter read as

foilows:

Section 58. The Legislature shall have full power and authority to provide by law for the management and control of the Prison System of Texas; and to this end shall have power and authority to place Prison System under the supervision, management and control of such trained and experienced officer, or officers, SECTION 2 The above Constitutional amendment shall be submitted to a vote of the quilified electors of this State at a general election to be held No-Constitution, abolishing the with a party on Tuesday night Board of Prison Commissioners. and all those opposing said amendment shall write or have printed on their battot the words "Against the amendment of Article 16, Section 58, of the Constitution, abolishing the Board of Prison Commissioners.

Proposed Amendment To The Constitution.

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 9

A resolution proposing an amendment to Art. 7, of the Constitution of the State of Texas by changing section 3, eliminating the provision au thorizing the Legislature to create special districts and mak. ing an appropriation therefor.

Be it Resolved by the Legisla. ture of the state of Texas:

SECTION 1. That Section 3, Article 7, of the Constitution be so changed as to read as follows: (creating new Section.)

"section 3. One-fourth of the revenue derived from the state Occupation taxes and poll tax of one dollar on every inhabitant of the State, between the ages of twenty-one and sixty years, shall be set apart annually for the benefit of the public free schools; and in addition thereto, there shall be levied and collected an annual ad valorem State tax of such an amount not to exceed thirty-five cents on the one hundred (\$100. 00) dollars valuation, as with the available school fund arising from all other sources, will be sufficient to maintain and support the public schools of this State for a period of not less than six months in each year, and it shall be the duty of the state Board of Education to set aside a sufficient amount out of the said tax to provide free text books for the use of children attending the public free schools of this State; provided, how ever, that should the limit of taxation herein named be in sufficient the deficit may be met by appropriation from the general funds of the State and the Legislature may also pro vide for the formation of school districts by general laws; and all such school districts may embrace parts of two or more counties, and the Legislature shall be authorized to pass laws for the assessment and collection of taxes in all said districts and for the management and control of the public school shall write or have printed on or 'schools districts, whether such districts are composed of terri tory wholly within a county or in parts of two or more counties, and the Legislature may autn orize an additional ad valorem tax to be levied and collected within all school districts heretofore formed or hereafter form ed, for the further maintenance of public free schools, and for the erection and equipment of school buildings therein; provided that a majority of the qualified property tax paying voters of the district voting at an election to be held for that purpose shall vote such tax not to exceed | thousand (2,000.00) dollars, or in any one year one (1.00) so much thereof as may be nec dollar on the hundred dollars essary, is hereby appropriated valuation of the property subject to taxation in such district, but the limitation upon the amount of school district tax herein authorized shall not apply to incorporated cities or towns constituting separate and independent school districts, nor to independent or common school districts created by

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution providing for taxation of school lands owned by counties.
