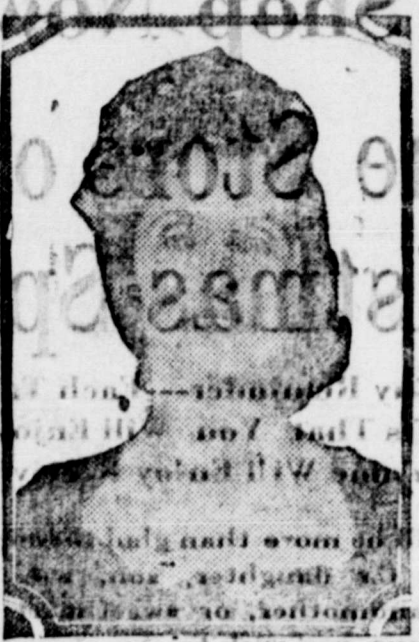

## Famous Galli-Curci to Be in San Angelo Dec. 14

Having sung to the largest opera crowds in history and scoring undying fame in recording phonograph records, Amelita Galli-Curci, world-famed soprano, is receiving the greatest ovations of her career on the 1929-30 tour and is to make her West Texas appearance in San Angelo on the evening of December 14.

Appearing as the second attraction on The Standard-Times concert series, the noted opera soprano is to be assisted by her husband, Homer Samuels, pianist, and Henry Bove, flutist.

A popular program is to be presented, this being one of the reasons her this season's tour is being acclaimed so highly. "Lo, Here the Gentle Lark" is a popular number she is to offer and one that is in hundreds of West Texas homes on phonograph records. Another of the popular numbers she is to sing is "Song of India," while others include "Spanish Serenade," "The Wren," "At the Edge of the Sea," "My Shadow," "I Meant to Do My Work Today," and "Shadow Song."

The classical numbers are to include selections from Schubert and Mozart.

Galli-Curci is to arrive in San Angelo on December 13 to rest until the following evening when she is to make her appearance in the Municipal Auditorium. Because of the size of the auditorium, The Standard Times has scaled the prices to where the most expensive seat is \$3.50, with the rate dwindling to \$1.50. With more than 900 season tickets sold, every indication points to a full house the evening of the concert. The ticket sale is to open at the City Drug Store on Dec. 9. This program is being put on without any idea of attempting to make a profit by The Standard Times. Galli-Curci is one of the most expensive artists on the American stage. She receives \$4,000 for her San Angelo appearance.

The last football game of the season was won on Thanksgiving day by the Robert Lee Steers.

A large number of Robert Lee fans accompanied the players to Miles. The game was hotly contested in the first quarter, but MacFarland made a touch down on a line plunger.

In the second quarter Robert scored highly, making three touchdowns. One was made by Boyd Smith, blocking a pass, another by Winfred Bize on a line plunge, and the third one by MacFarland on an off-tackle play.

In the third quarter Miles was able to make two touchdowns on a penalty and on intercepted pass. Fikes recovered a fumble and shortly after MacFarland, on a line plunge, made a race thru a broken field for another touch down.

In the last quarter Cliff received a pass and ran thirty yards for a touchdown. This made the score 40 to 18 in favor of the Steers.

For the whole season just closed, Robert Lee has won six games out of nine. Fifteen of our boys have "lettered" during the season, four of them finishing their high school football careers. These four are Boyd Smith, Henson Fikes, A. ton Roberts, Royston McFarland.
