## 5,000 Birthday Balls to Honor President January 30 And to Help Finance Fight on Infantile Paralysis



GETTING READY FOR THE BIGGEST BIRTHDAY PARTY IN AMERICAN HISTORY

Every community in the nation will honor President Roosevelt when he becomes 62 years old on Tuesday, Jan. 30, by giving a local ball to help endow an extension of the nation-wide work of the Warm Springs Foundation for Infantile Paralysis in which the President was deeply interested. The cake, weighing 344 pounds and said to be the largest birthday cake ever made, was presented to the children for their party by Chairman Doherty.
