Manager of Bronte Rodeo Says Preparation Complete

Bronte, Texas, June 22.—Everything is in readiness for the Bronte rodeo which is scheduled for Thursday, Friday and Saturday, June 28-29-30.

C. M. Baker, manager of the rodeo, has completed all the details of the rodeo grounds which are permanently located in the Hearn park. The corral and chutes and other essentials to first-class rodeo equipment, are as good as can be found anywhere. There is ample shade in the park, afforded by the large mot of pecan trees.

Practically all the rodeo performers, both cowboys and cow girls, have been booked. Purses amounting to \$750 have been provided and the management has had a large quantity of programs printed and scattered promiscuously throughout the country.

One of the biggest attractions will be the string of Hamlin broncs. These are said to be the worst string of bucking, pitching, pawing broncs ever brought to a rodeo. The riders have already been booked and "the old West" of the real kind will be brought out in this feature of the big three days' program. Jimmie Morris of the Swenson ranch near Hamlin, will be in charge of the string of horse outlaws.

There will be many other attractions, such as candid-te speaking by those seeking both state and county offices; carnival attractions will also be on hand and a big dance each night.

Bronte citizens are joining in the spirit of the big affair, and the invitation is sent out to each and all, both far and near, not to miss this big annual affair that Bronte stages each year at this time.

A Resolution

State of Texas,

Whereas, the commissioners' court of Coke county, Texas, has discussed and fully considered the advisability of the county's participation in a Texas Relief Commission Canning Project for said Coke county;

And whereas, at this particular time the city of Robert Lee, which is the county seat town of said county, is faced with a shortage in their supply and sufficient water suitable to be used in such a canning project cannot be obtained at this time;

And whereas, there is a severe drouth now prevailing in said county which has caused an under supply of vegetables and farm products;

And whereas, it is now the opinion of the commissioners' court of Coke county that the establishment of such a canning project in this county at this time would be an unwise expenditure of Coke county funds and Texas Relief Commission funds;

Therefore be it resolved, that the commissioners' court of Coke county express its sentiments to the Texas Relief Commission, and assure them that they are willing to cooperate with the Texas Relief Commission in such canning project when the proper situation presents itself, and when vegetables and farm products and water are available in such quantities and amounts as would make such project feasible. It is also the desire of the commissioners' court to express to the Texas Relief Commission the maximum amount which it would be willing to expend upon such a project, when the conditions hereinbefore mentioned warrants such expenditure, which amount is \$100 00.

Seeks Re-election for a Second Term in Congress

Word from Dallas headquarters states that United States Senator Tom Connally will return to Texas immediately after the adjournment of Congress, and will take personal charge of his campaign for re-election for a second term in the Senate.

J. P. Rice, of Dallas, recently appointed campaign manager for the Texas junior Senator, says:

"I have just returned from a motor trip of 8,000 made during the past few weeks into every section of the state. I find the sentiment for Senator Connally so overwhelming that there can be no doubt that the people of Texas are unwilling that he should be penalized for remaining at his post of duty, loyally supporting the President of the United States and aiding in the perfection of the New Deal, instead of having his constituency unrepresented in order to further his personal political fortunes."

In a speech delivered by Senator Connally in Congress, April 8, 1934, we find abundant proof that the junior Senator is loyally standing behind the President in his Recovery Program. In the climax of that speech he says:

"We are now on the upgrade. We are now back on the road to recovery. The hungry have been fed, the naked have been clothed, the unemployed are again busy with the implements of their toil at gainful occupations. Business is reviving."

Coke County Farmers Get Reduction Checks

E. R. Lawrence, county agent, states that the farmers are getting their cotton reduction checks now and that Coke county has received 450 checks for a total of \$21,314.04. There remains 91 checks to be received and Mr. Lawrence is expecting these at an early date.

Applications have been received for securing bale tags on old cotton or cotton produced before June 1, 1934. Producers who now have cotton on hand are urged by the county agent to get in touch with him as soon as possible and make out application for bale tags. This cotton is not subject to the tax, however, each bale must bear a tag before it can be sold.

250,000 Accidents Occur During the Past Six Years

Wars and rumors of wars always arouse the public to intense excitement, but peacetime casualty lists are, it seems, scanned hastily and passed over as a matter of course news.

Despite efforts of newspapers continually preaching safety, accidents continue to pile up a staggering total of killed and injured.

Bare facts, and not phrases, are most striking to the mind, so the public can stand to be shocked by the information that six people are killed every day, and one accident happens every twelve minutes on the highways of this state of ours.

Give thought to that, and to the fact that in the last six years there have been 250,000 accidents of which 11 hundred and twenty-six thousand were injured by automobiles.

This is the cost paid in human life. Property damage in the same period amounted to thirty-one million dollars, a staggering sum to be sacrificed because of carelessness.

The state, automobile clubs, safety leagues, insurance companies, and other agencies are doing all in their power to cut down this casualty list, but these organizations, no matter how much they legislate, and no matter how hard they try, can not accomplish what they would like to without the full cooperation of every hand that is laid to a steering wheel.

Inspection campaigns and the new financial responsibility act are doing a great deal to curb this appalling catastrophe, but unless the individual motorist and the pedestrian shoulder their share of the responsibility, death and injury will continue to hold sway.

Until we learn to cut out taking chances, the accident rate will not be lowered, and sooner or later the fellow who laughs this off may pay the penalty, personally.

But even then, when tragedy strikes home, sympathy is supposed to supersede criticism.

Be cautious, and criticism and casualties will not come your way.—Free Press, Quakertown, Pennsylvania.

Communism has tried to rule out all thoughts of God and faith, while thriving communities furnish centers for sound and constructive Christian work.

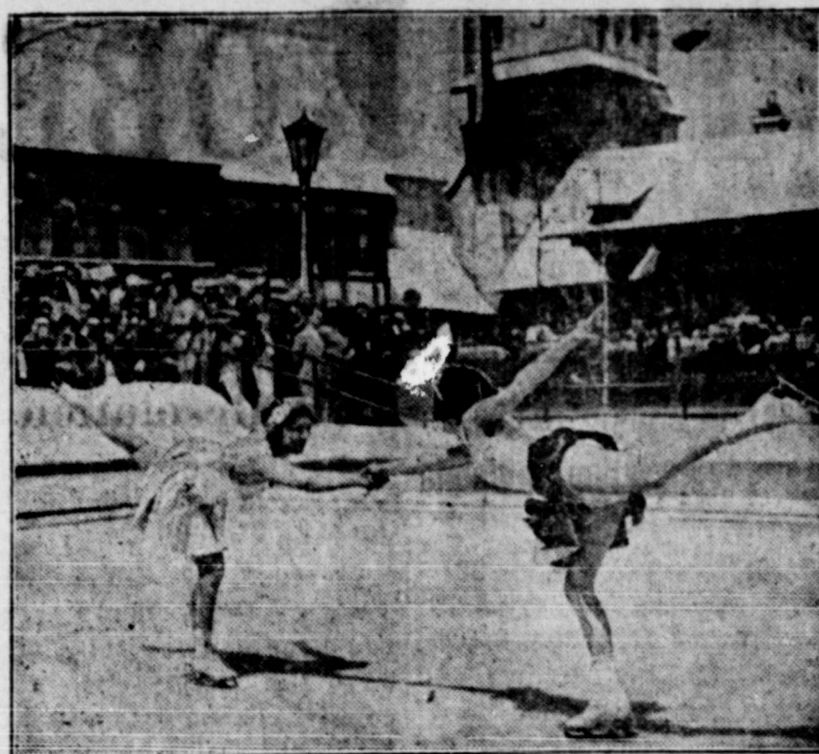

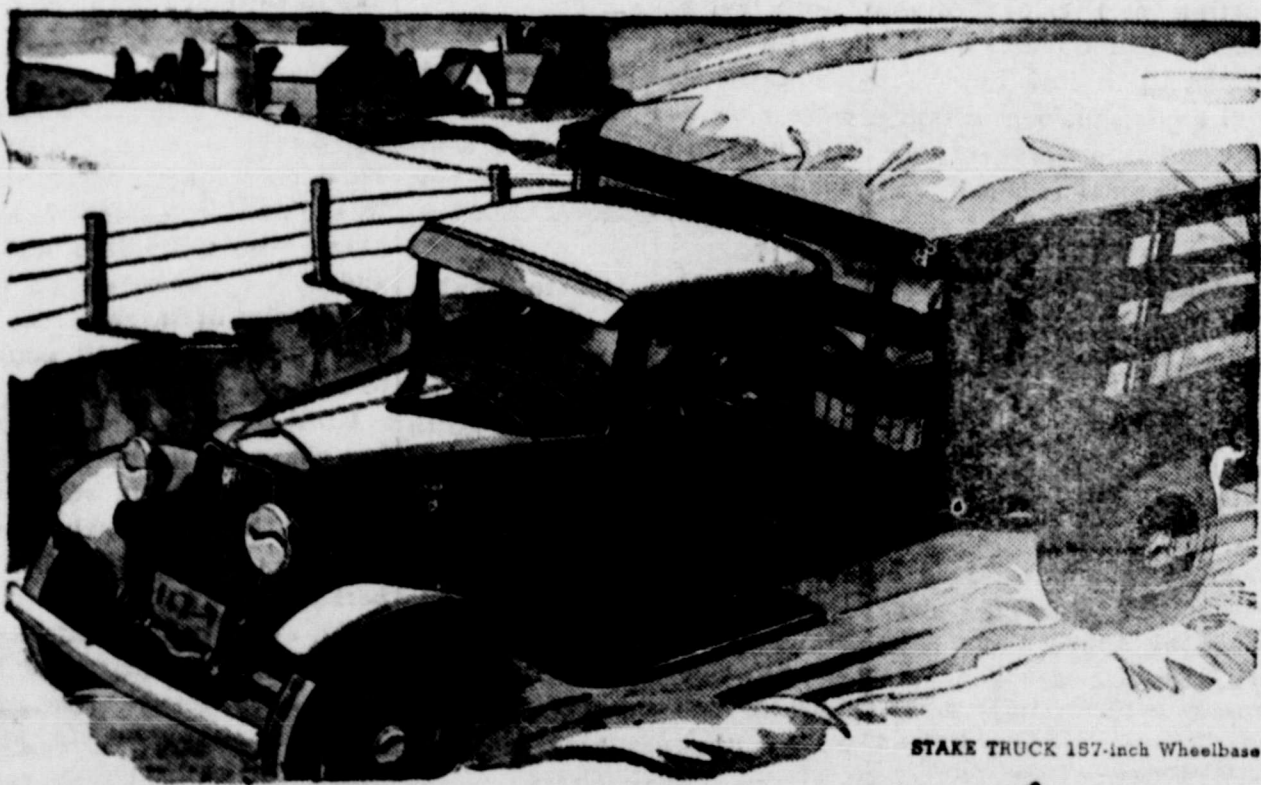

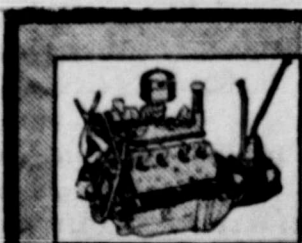

ON TEXAS FARMS

So successful was the huge beef canning program for relief purposes last winter in Texas that the Extension Service has been asked to help national relief leaders work out the same program for the entire drought area in the United States. Miss Mildred Horton, state home demonstration agent, has been

helping with details in Washington. The reopened canning plant in Amarillo is to be visited by workers from other states for guidance.

Relief agencies spent about \$500,000 on the entire beef canning relief program in Texas last winter, including cost of cattle and all labor and material charges. A product worth \$776,986 was obtained, value being determined by the lowest competitive commercial bid received in a cost investigation.

Texas farmers and ranchers sold 21,320 culler cows for an average of about \$5 per head above market quotations, and 9,439 unemployed persons were given wages of \$18 per week. An average of about 3,000 people were employed steadily for 26 days.

Each worker in the relief can-

ning turned out an average of 40 cans of beef per day. Labor cost per day was \$2, material cost per person, \$4.50, and value of output \$8.44 per person per day. The net gain or saving to the public was about \$1.94 per person per day.

With hundreds of thousands of starving cattle in drought regions, it is not surprising, in view of the remarkable success of the Texas experiment in killing, cutting and canning beef the A. & M. way, the national relief leaders have adopted the Texas plan for national application.
