OUR FAVORITE RECIPE

Apricot Whip 1 cup apricot pulp 2 egg whites 1-8 teaspoon salt

14 cup sugar 1 tablespoon lemon juice, if de-

Wash one cup of dried apricots. Cover with hot water and soak for one hour. (They may be cooked without soaking). Simmer for 30 to 40 minutes until tender. Mash apricots to a pulp or force through colander. Beat egg whites until stiff, gradually beating in the salt and sugar. Fold in the cooled apricot pulp. Add the lemon juice. Pile lightly into dessert dishes and chill before serving.

Dried prunes, dried or canned peaches, orange juice and pulp may be substituted for the apricots. More or less sugar and lemon juice will be necessary depending on the fruit used.

2. The apricot whip may be cooked in the double boiler. Cook until thick but not dry, stirring constantly.
