## The proprietors of the tele- hone, the invention of Alexander Graham Bell, for which patents have been issued by the United States and Great Britain, are now prepared to furnish telephones for the transmission of articulate speech through in. of articulate speech through in- struments not more than 20 miles apart. Conversation can be easily carried on after slight practice and with the occasional practice and with the oceasional repetition of a word or sentence. On first listening to the telephone, though the sound is

perfectly audible, the articula-
tion seems to be indistinct; but
after a few trials the ear be-
comes accustomed to the pecu-
liar sound and finds litite dif-
ficulty in understanding the
words."

vertisement of May, 1877 , represents
