

### Winter Cover Crop Approved For 1949

Coke county farmers can now receive information on the winter legume cover crop. Applications will be taken in the AAA office for this practice prior to seeding. Winter legumes must be properly innoculated with fresh inoculants and seeded not later than December 1, 1948. Phosphate must be applied at a rate of not less than the equivalent of 200 pounds of 20 per cent superphosphate per acre, except on land where there has been an application of phosphate to some prior crop.

For prices on winter legumes contact the AAA office.
