A special election is set for next Tuesday, Nov. 8, when ten amendments to the state constitution will be submitted to Texas voters. Each congressional district will also elect a member of the new state board of education as provided in the Gilmer-Aiken Act.

Trichinosis is a big word, but the disease is easy to prevent. All you need to do is cock the meat! until the pink color turns to white. When the change of color occurs, the meat is safe to eat. Farmers who raise hogs for sale as meat, and who feed them garbage, should cook the garbage first, or the meat may become contaminated. If butchered pork is stored at a temperature of five degrees above zero, Fahrenheit, for 20 days, trichinosis parasites should die, if there are any.

If a person eats a pork chop, for example, that contains trichinae, they are swallowed in the form of tiny capsules. In the intestines these capsules develop and discharge minute worms which are carried by the bloodstream to various parts of the body-settling in muscles, where after a period of time they become calcified and

What are the symptoms of trichinosis? Stomach upsets and muscular pains a feeling of chilliness, sore throat, and sometimes considerable fever, are some of the signs. An acute attack of the illness lasts about one or two weeks. The disease has a low death rate, but recovery is fairly slow.




