# Orlan Gunnels, 19, Victim Of Tragic Hunting Mishap







Each year the county agent's office has offered whatever help it could give to ranchers and farmers in filing their income tax reports. Here are a few questions and answers most often asked regarding income tax reports About the only change is the rate which will be slightly h gher than 1949.


