FOOTBALL GAME OFF

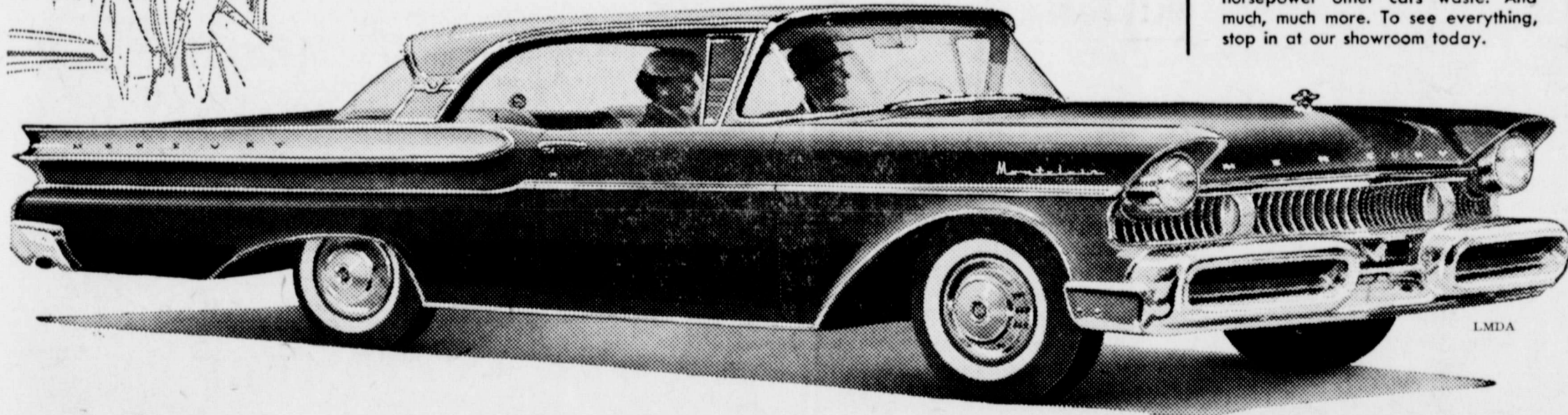
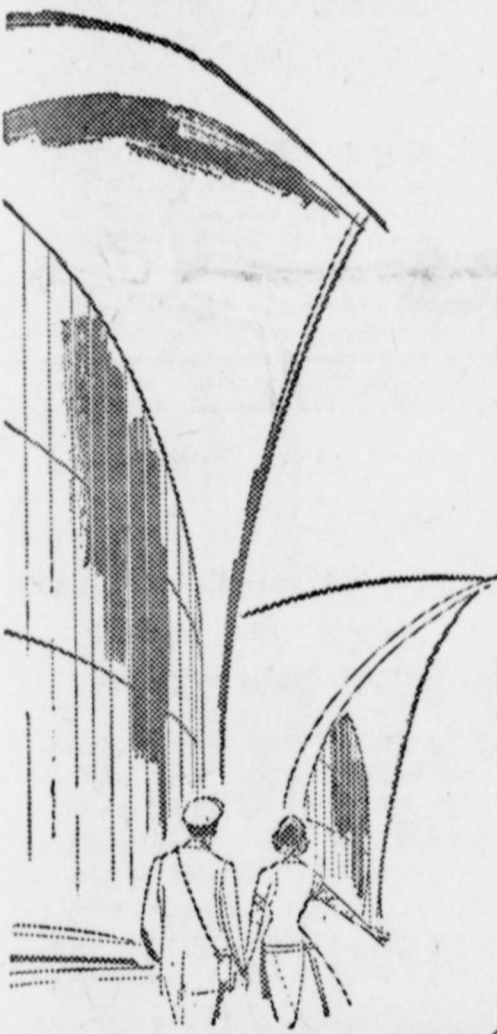
