

It is believed that the only force capable of changing the policy in North Vietnam toward prisoners of war is an aroused public opinion. For that reason private citizens across the nation are writing letters urging release of captured American servicemen.

This is one thing that any person can do for the heroic fighting men now held in "tiger cages" and treated like animals of the jungle. If you have not already written a letter to Hanoi asking release of these captives, you are urged to do so at once. A second, or even third letter, would be appreciated. Address your letter to: Ton Due Thank, President of the Democratic Republic of Vietnam, Hanoi, North Vietnam. Ordinary letters require 13c postage for the first ounce and 8c for each additional ounce thereafter. Air mail letters are 25c for each half ounce.
