In compliance with the requirements of the state, the city is posting new signs stating regulations for dumping. These include: All trash shall be dumped into pits. No car bodies shall be dumped into pits. No firearms or scavenging shall be allowed. If these regulations are not followed by the residents of the city and area, other action to be considered by the City Council will be imposing fines for anyone ignoring the signs, and the possibility of mandatory garbage collection by the city.



County, Cities **Get First Checks** From Uncle Sam

Coke County received \$30,171 in its first check from the federal revenue sharing program, it was announced Tuesday by County Judge W. W. Thetford.

The judge said the county will get another \$30,000 later. The City of Robert Lee received \$1,635 and the City of Bronte got \$1,746 of

the federal money. Judge Thetford said the money can be used for various county needs as they arise. The county money, he said has been deposited in a special account until commissioners have time to make a

study of needs. Members of the Commissioners' Court have been contacted by several persons on the possibility of piping treated water into the rural areas of the county. They have checked with the Farmers Home Administration, as well as land owners in the area. FHA informed them that in order to get any help from the federa' government, the project would have to be county wide.

It was brought out that such & project would be beneficial to the area, since so much water is unfit for home use in many rural areas. Many rural families have moved to town in order to have good water and a good supply. Many ranches do not have enough water to stock the land as heavily as it would otherwise support.

Mayor S. E. Adams said the city is very thankful for its share of the federal money, and indicated there were many uses for it. The mayor also said the city sales tax revenue was up last quarter with the city's share amounting to \$1200.


