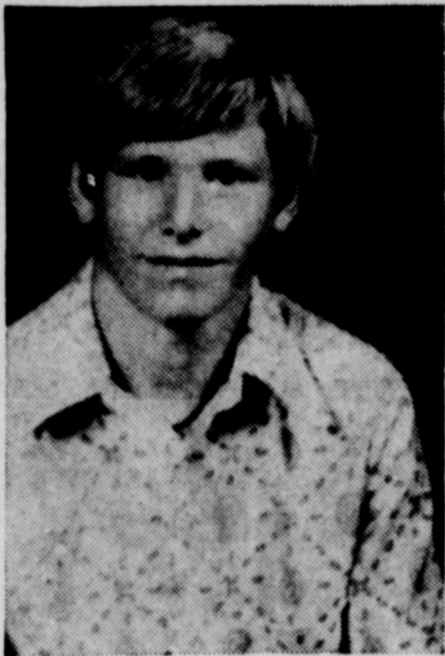

Willis Parker, 42, principal of Baird Elementary School and former band teacher in Robert Lee School, died at 5 a.m. Sunday in an Abilene hospital after a short illness.

Funeral services were held at 3 p.m. Monday in Baird First United Methodist Church with burial in Ross Cemetery in Baird.

Born Feb. 21, 1931, in Ohio, he married Joyce McCorstin March 13, 1951, in Ballinger. They moved to Baird in 1969 from Robert Lee where he was band teacher from 1966 to 1969.

Mr. Parker was a member of the Methodist Church. He graduated from Eden High School. He received his bachelor's degree from East Texas State University and his master's degree from Abilene Christian College.

Survivors are his wife; two daughters, Mrs. Gary (Linda) Goble of Baird and Cindy Parker of the home; his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Leonard Parker of Baird; a brother, Jud Parker of Stamford; and his paternal grandmother, Mrs. Rosina Parker of Marion, Ohio.

Shandley Commissioned Robert Lee Postmaster

During a unique ceremony last Wednesday, Jan. 23, in the presence of some 15 area postmasters, Raymond D. Shandley, 46, was commissioned Postmaster of Robert Lee. The commission was presented by Sectional Center Manager David E. Holster of Midland. Shandley, a native Texan, has been officer-in-charge of the Robert Lee Post Office since the retirement of Hugh S. (Bub) Lewis on Oct. 12, 1973.

The presentation was made during a U. S. Postal Service retail management seminar which was held at El Patio Motel in San Angelo Jan. 21-23, and was attended by many area postmasters.

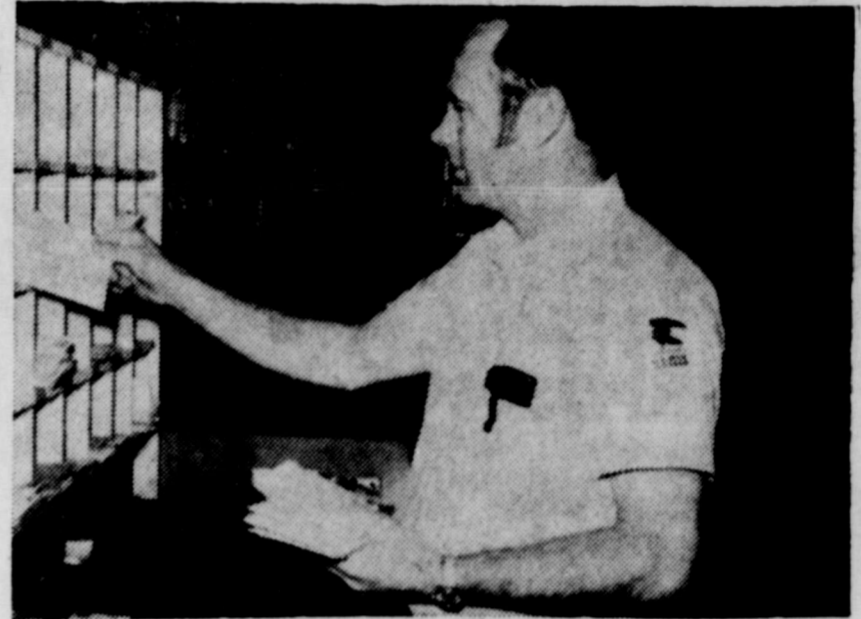
The commission was signed personally by Postmaster General E. T. Klassen. In an announcement made earlier by Regional Postmaster General Carl C. Ulsaker, 10 postmasters were appointed in Texas effective Jan. 5, and Shandley was among them. Postmaster selections are made from among postal career people by a Regional Management Selection Board composed of educators, businessmen and labor arbitrators. Selections are made on the USPS Merit System.

Shandley began his postal career in the Odessa Post Office Aug. 11, 1949. He was a city mail carrier and also drove a parcel post delivery truck there. He was appointed temporary rural carrier in 1954 and began the first rural route in Odessa. He carried a mounted city delivery route for two years.

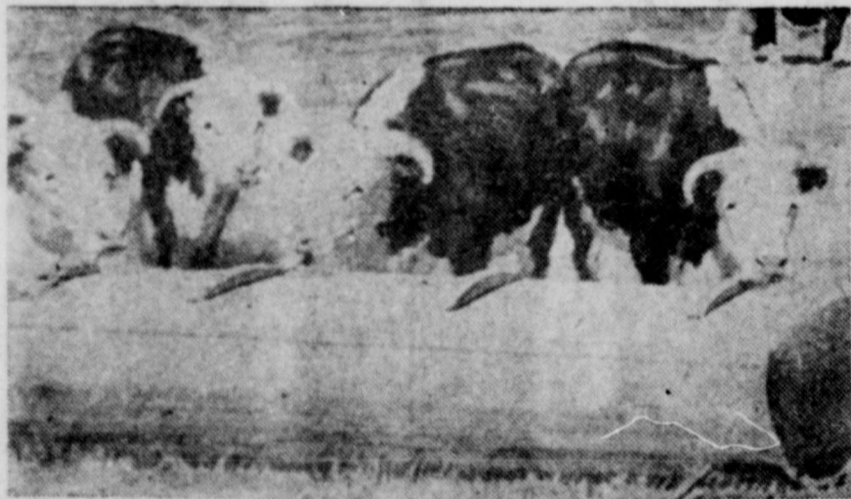
