

The commission was presented by Sectional Center Manager David E. Holster of Midland. Shandley, a native Texan, has been officer-in-charge of the Robcet Lee Post Office since the retirment of Hugh S. (Bub) Lewis on Oct. 12, 1973.

The presentation was made during a U. S. Postal Service retail management seminar which was held at El Patio Motel in San Angelo Jan. 21-23, and was attended by many area postmasters.
