

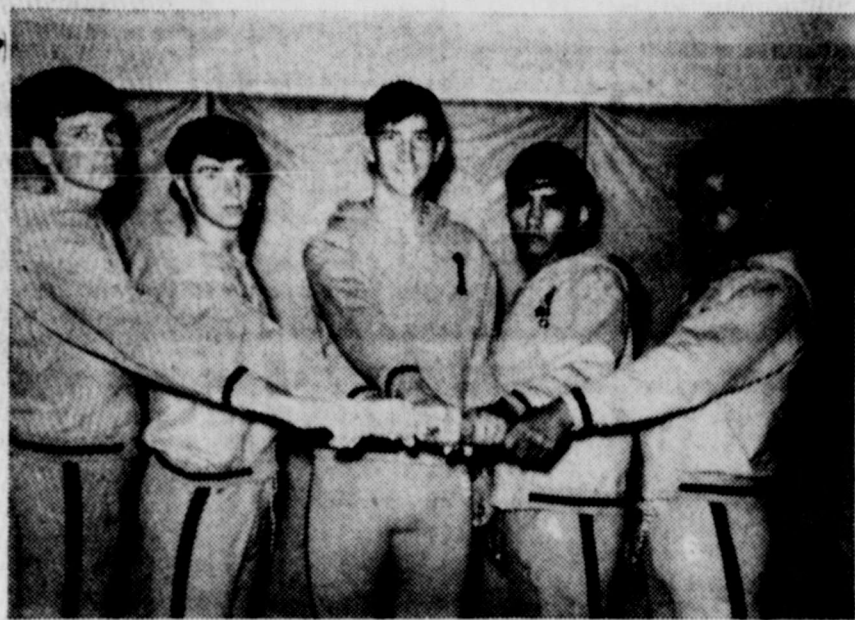

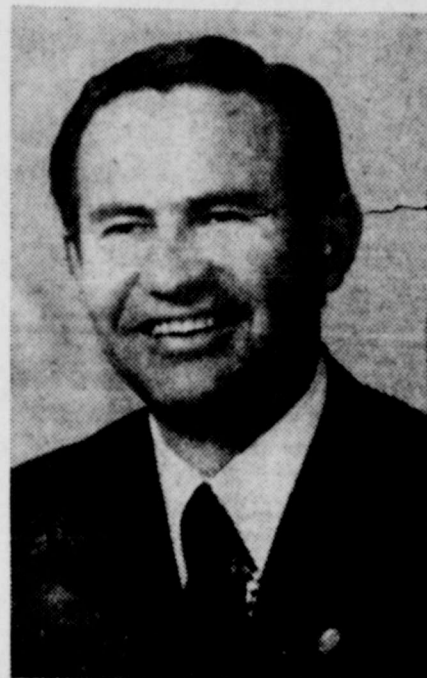
Tim Rowoldt was second in 88 yard dash.

Grindstaff, 42, is a graduate of Ballinger High School and holds B.B.A. and LL.B. degrees from



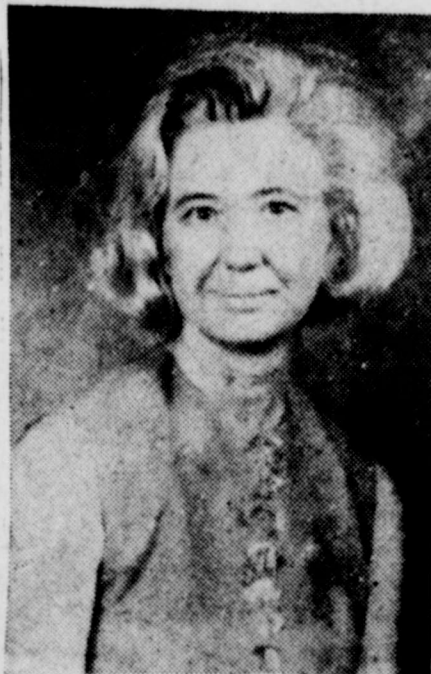

Incumbents Back In Various Offices

Mayor Stanley E. Adams was returned to office here in Saturday's city election along with two incumbent city aldermen.

Adams gained reelection with 58 votes while aldermen Royce G. Hood and Jimmy O. Bell each received 61 votes in the city council election. None of the men had opponents in their races. Robert Vaughan received one write-in vote for mayor and Ben Bessent received one for alderman. A total of 63 votes were cast.

In the West Coke County Hospital District election, incumbents Fannell Smith and J. D. Harmon and new candidate Fern Havins were elected to the board of directors. Smith received 73 votes, Harmon 75 and Havins 75. The three were unopposed. J. E. Quisenberry, longtime member of the board, did not seek reelection. Seventy-six voted in the hospital election. Joe Ash received one write-in vote.

Two incumbents on Robert Lee Independent School District board also were reelected Saturday. Wilfer Millican and J. C. Wallace Jr. were unopposed on the school ballot. Millican received 99 votes and Wallace 98. Ninety-nine was the total votes cast in the school election.

Incumbent George Newby was reelected as Precinct 1 county school trustee with 66 votes. Lewis Heuvel received one write-in vote. Sixty-eight voted.

Incumbent D. O. King was reelected county school trustee for Precinct 3, receiving all 27 votes cast.

The 880 yard relay team, composed of Marilyn Wright, Elizabeth Bickley, Kathy Deen and Konny Service, came out fifth.

2132 Eligible for Vote in Primary

A total of 2,132 Coke County citizens will be eligible to vote in the Democratic Primary election on May 4, according to figures released this week by Tax Assessor Collector O. B. Jacobs.

A last minute rush from Precincts 2 and 4 ran the total up to this new high. Both precincts have contested races for commissioner and Precinct 2 has a contest for justice of the peace.

Jacobs listed the number of voters in each precinct as follows: Precinct 1, 626; Precinct 2, 589; Precinct 3, 366; Precinct 4, 440; Precinct 9, 111.

Absentee voting will begin Monday, April 15, and continue through the fourth day preceding the election.

"You Can Do It" New TV Series

A weekly television series for local and area "do-it-yourselfers" will premiere on KTXS, Channel 12, at 11:30 a.m. Friday, April 13, for residents of Coke County and surrounding counties in Extension District VII.

"You Can Do It," featuring hostess Cindy Kidwell, is a 13 part educational series on home care and repairs, aimed at helping viewers learn simple, money saving techniques for home care and maintenance, according to its producers.

Surrounding counties include Runnels, Taylor, Nolan, Tom Green, Concho, Coleman and several counties near Abilene.

Viewers of the first program will learn how to do simple electric repairs.

Other programs include how to make and use low cost cleaners and how to repair leaky faucets.

Also viewers will learn how to make toilet repairs and adjustments, how to caulk and weather-strip, paint interiors and exteriors, repair walls and care for wood finishes and carpets.

In addition, the series explains care and maintenance of ranges and refrigerators, and how to make storage space.

The 30 minute program will be aired each Friday for 13 weeks.

Sponsored in each county by the County Family Living Committee, the series was created and produced by home economics specialists with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, Texas A&M University System, through a special grant from the United States Department of Agriculture, for airing throughout the state.

The students pictured here were winners in the district UIL literary meet and qualified for competition in the regional contest which will be held April 18, 19 and 20 at Stephenville.

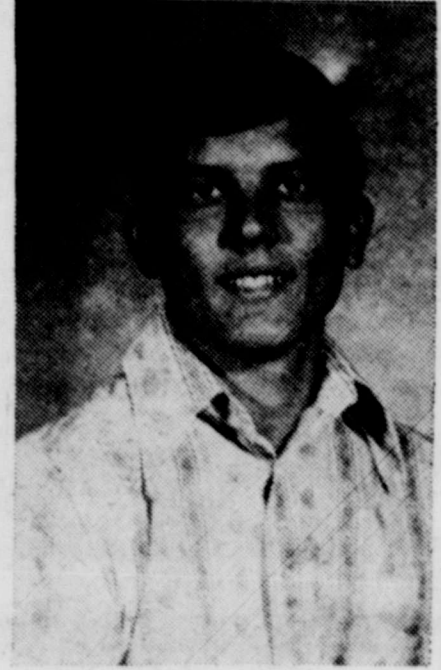

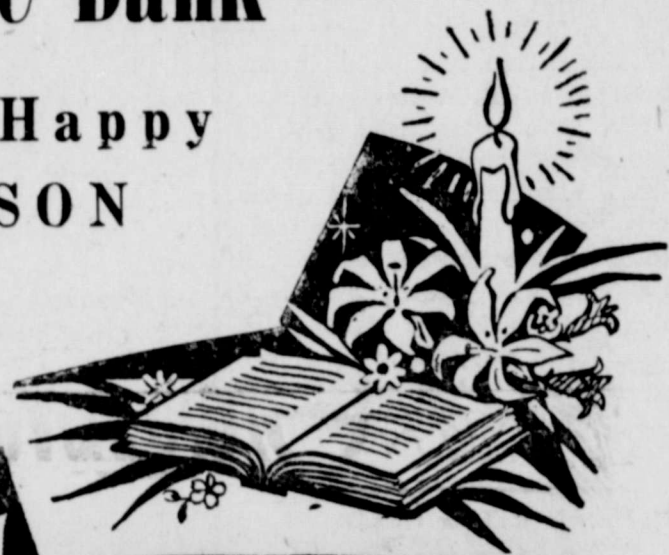
