Mr. Hannaford was born Feb. 8, 1907, in Pear Valley. He moved to Shackelford County in 1916. He was a graduate of Hardin-Simmons University with a B. A. degree in education. He also attended Texas Tech University and received a M. A. degree in education from Sul Ross University. He taught in a number of West Texas schools and was superintendent at Robert Lee in 1947 and 1948.

This modern-day version of a pan dowdy uses canned red tart cherries to delight both the traditionalists and modernists.

**CHERRY PAN DOWDY**

**Filling**

- |                        |   |
|------------------------|---|
| 1 cup granulated sugar | 2 No. 303 cans red tart pitted cherries |
| ¼ cup cornstarch       | ½ tablespoon lemon juice                |
| dash salt              | ¼ teaspoon almond flavoring             |
| ¼ teaspoon cinnamon    | 2 tablespoons butter or margarine       |
| ¾ teaspoon nutmeg      | few drops red food coloring             |

Combine sugar, cornstarch, salt, cinnamon and nutmeg; add to cherries and juice in a saucepan. Cook over low heat, stirring constantly, until thick. Remove from heat and add lemon juice, almond flavoring, butter and food coloring. Pour into greased 8 x 8 x 2 inch baking dish.

| 2 cups biscuit mix | ¼ cup sugar         |
| ¾ cup milk         | 1 teaspoon cinnamon |

Stir biscuit mix and milk together just until blended. Drop by tablespoonfuls into mixture of sugar and cinnamon. Place biscuits on top of cherry filling and bake in a 400° F. oven about 30 minutes. Makes 6 to 8 servings.

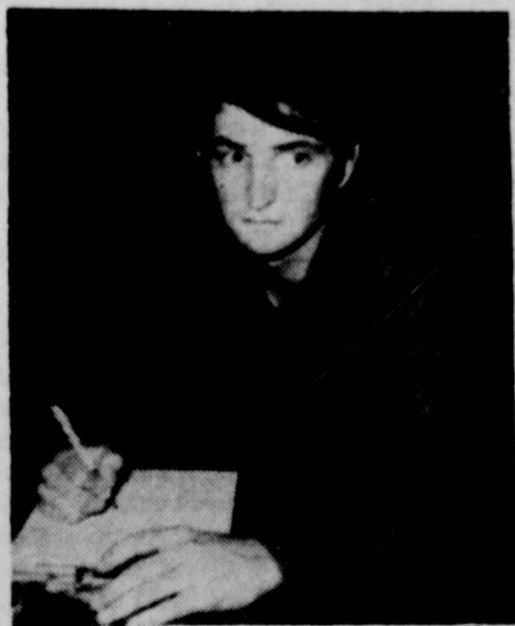

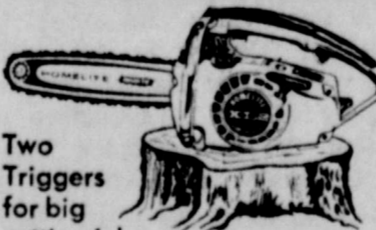

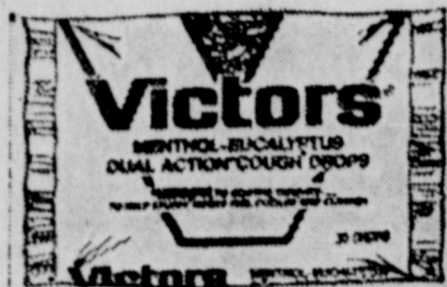
