

Official hosts for the San Antonio meeting are the members of the Texas Council of Chapters.


#### 32 BOYS AND GIRLS ATTEND 4-H FUN DAY MONDAY

The Coke County 4-H Fun Day held Monday in the Robert Lee Park was attended by 32 boys and girls.




