### BEEF SHORT COURSE OFFERED AT BRONTE

A beef production short course for adult farmers will be held Sept. 8-11 under the sponsorship of the Bronte High School Vocational Agriculture Department, according to Supt. C. B. Barbee and Gary York, teacher of Vocational Agriculture.

Dr. Elmer V. Krehbiel, Beef Production Specialist with the Vocational Agriculture Division of the Texas Education Agency and the Department of Animal Science at Texas A&M University, will be the instructor for the course. He is headquartered at Texas A&M.

All farmers and ranchmen who are interested in improving their beef production methods is invited to enroll in the course.

### BITES IN AMARILLO FOR MRS. MCCrackEN

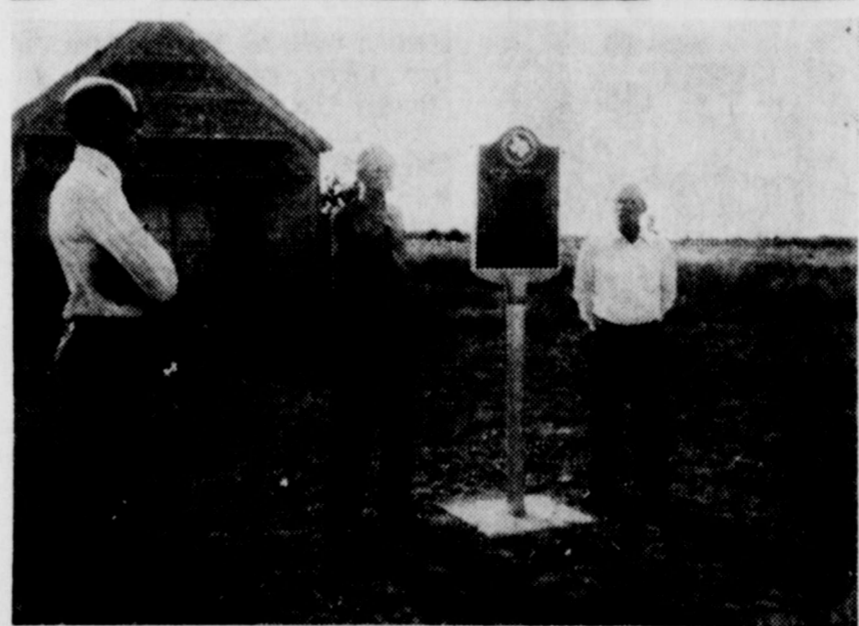

KPEP Radio of San Angelo has recently changed hands and has announced Dick Sims as president and general manager. He is also president of Simstone Broadcasting Corporation, owner of KPED, with partner Robert W. Stone-street of Houston.

Sims, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Sims of Robert Lee, began his radio career with a San Angelo station and has spent the last 12 years in Houston with KULF, KIKK, KBUK and KXYZ.

Plans are under way at KPEP for renovation of the station and area, playing more music (and definitely remaining country), enlightening programming and adding more professionalism to the entire broadcasting media.

"KPEP is the second oldest country radio station in America, second only to KDAV of Lubbock," Sims commented.
