## Farm Bureau to Have Open House Sunday

The officers, directors and members of the Coke County Farm Bureau are inviting the public to visit and inspect the Farm Bureau's new office building in Robert Lee Sunday afternoon. The local farm group has just completed a new home for their Coke County home and they invite the public to come by from 2 to 4 p.m. Sunday.

The Coke County Farm Bureau has officed in an old Army Barracks building for many years and point to and occupy with pride their new building) across from the courthouse and adjacent to the post office in Robert Lee.

Offices are provided for Mrs. C. E. Arrott, who has been secretary-treasurer of the organization since its inception in 1945. She worked at her job many years without any kind of office.

The Coke County Farm Bureau was organized in 1945 and C. E. Arrott was its first president and served until 1953. R. B. Allen was vice president; Mrs. Arrott was elected secretary-treasurer at that time and has held the job down to this day. The bureau had 18 original members, but a membership drive in 1946 increased the membership to 53. Will Carr was service agent.

O. T. Colvin served as president in 1954 and 1955 and James Arrott was veep. Dues were increased to \$7.50 and a goal of

Mr. Prentice was born July 19, 1891, in Silver Point, Tenn. He married Gladys Sutton Jan. 17, 1916, in Carthage, Tenn. The couple moved to Buffalo Gap in 1945. Mrs. Prentice died Sept. 17, 1972.

Mr. Prentice was a Methodist. ## New Activities Set for County Fair

Some unusual and interesting activities have been planned for the Saturday night Celebration to be held in the Robert Lee Park Saturday night, Sept. 20, at the conclusion of the Coke County Fair which will begin Sept. 18 and go through Sept. 21 at the Coke County Recreation and Show Center at Robert Lee.

At 6 p.m. the program will get under way with a posthole digging contest to see who can dig a post hole 6 inches in diameter at bottom and is 18 inches deep, in the shortest time, using a crow bar and dirt scoop. Anyone may enter and entrants must furnish their own crow bar and scoop. Entries close at noon on the day of the contest.

At 6:30 p.m., there will be a bubble blowing contest. This will have a junior division (1-17) and a senior division (18 and over). The audience will be the judges to see who can blow the largest gum bubble. Contestants will be furnished with two pieces of gum and will be allowed approximately three minutes to get the chew worked. Each contestant will be allowed three tries. Entries close at noon Sept. 20.

There will be a Country Music Show at 7 p.m. and this will be followed by the Beau and Belle Coronation at 8 p.m. Each class of the Bronte and Robert Lee Schools will select delegates to be presented for the Beau and Belle Coronation. Division winners (including Grade School, Junior High and High School) will be announced and crowned at this part of the Saturday night celebration. Western and/or "old timey" attire will be the accepted mode of dress.

A square dance, which is scheduled to start at 8:30 p.m., will conclude the Saturday night program.

Coalson, vice president. Ben Boykin took over as president in 1963 and served through 1967. H. H. Holland was vice president during his tenure of office and Mrs. Arrott continued as secretary-treasurer. In 1963 the bureau sent Mrs. Arrott to attend a secretary's school in Waco and sent Sandra Thomas, Ida Lee Parker and Benny Boykin to Citizenship Seminar. Peggy Corley was the Queen for 1963. In 1964 Jan Wilkins was Senior Queen, Kay Roberts was Intermediate Queen and Peppy Boykin was Junior Queen. Jo Alice Evans was the bureau's Talent Find of the Year. Three volunteer firemen, Kenneth Reid, Cecil Coalson, R. C. Sawyer, as well as vice president Wayne Arrott, attended Firemen's School. Queen Contest winners in 1965 were Brenda Scott, senior, Kay Roberts, Intermediate; Rosanna Boykin, junior. Talent Finds were Jerry Don Holcombe, 1st, and Bennie Carol Oglesby and Janet Lee,

2nd. The Coke Bureau sent LeDrew Arrott to the Institute on Wheels."

In 1966 Dolan Mackey was made Service Agent and it was voted that an office be kept open three days a week. The local bureau also entered the "Safemark" tire and battery program. It was the year that Glenn Roach, Charles Masterson and Robert Gallaway were sent to the Citizenship Seminar, and the old building was painted and fixed up. An open house was on Sept. 19, 1966.

Wayne Arrott became president from 1968-70, with Fred McCabe Jr. serving as vice president. Mrs. C. E. Arrott continued on as secretary-treasurer. Darrell Pitcock and Joy Cervenka went to the Citizenship Seminary. Membership in 1970 went up to 250 members. Sheri Pitcock and Susan Cumbie and Donald Thompson attended the Seminar.

Wayne Arrott resigned as president to become service agent. Fred McCabe Jr. took over his job. Finis Harmon became vice president. Accidental death insurance became a part of the program and dues were increased to \$16.50. Susan Arrott, Wayne Counts and Lynn Lawhon were sent to the Seminar.

Officers remained the same for 1972. Debbie Hendry was the Senior Queen, while Sterling Allen and Sherry Baker were Talent Finds.

The District Queen Contest was held in Robert Lee, with Coke, Tom Green and Howard County candidates entering.

The 1972 Talent Find for the County was Sterling Allen, and Larry Hooper was sent to the Citizenship Seminar.

Officers remained the same for 1973 and 74. Attending the Citizenship Seminar were Diane Arrott, Norma Thomson and David Wilkes. TASCO Agency was given to Bob Wrinkle.

A total of 304 members was attained in 1974. Debra Hibbs, Karen Blair and Elaine Millican attended the Citizenship Seminar. Thurston McCutchen was added as special service agent to work under Wayne Arrott.

New officers elected for 1975 and currently serving the Coke County Farm Bureau are James Allen, president; Finis Harmon, vice president; Mrs. C. E. Arrott (the old standby) secretary-treasurer.

The Coke Bureau has held a county convention each year and has sent delegates to the state convention each year.

They started making plans for their new building in January, drawing up plans. The old building was sold in April and work was started on the new home. The Coke County Farm Bureau moved into its new home May 30, 1975.



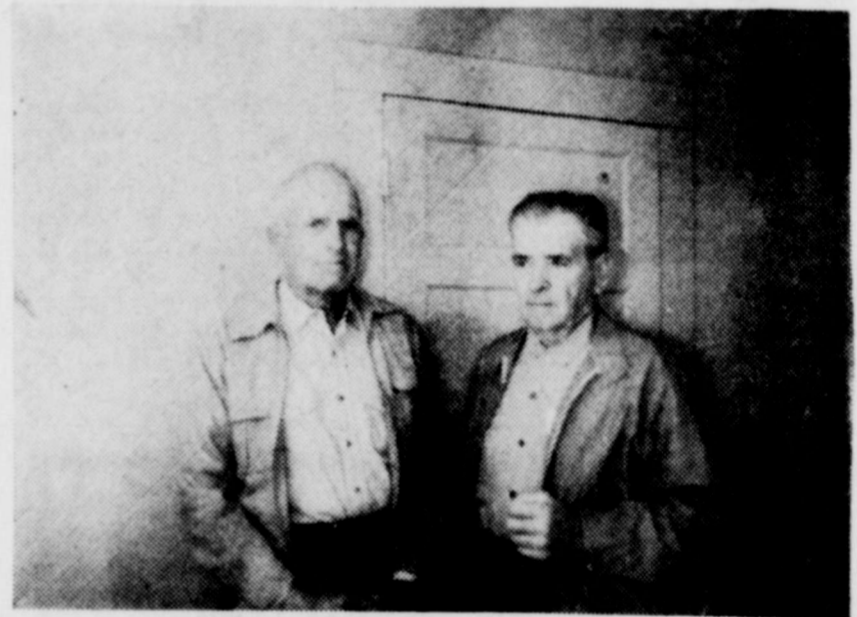

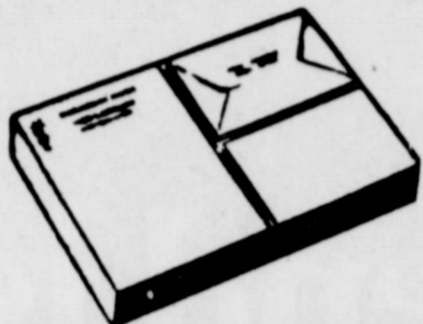
**MRS. DICKSON DIES**
