





Teachers from Bronte, Robert Lee and Sterling City will be among the educators of this area who will attend the annual fall convention of District XV of the Texas State Teachers Associaton in Brownwodd Oct. 26 and 27.

ANTLERLESS DEER PERMITS AVAILABLE IN COKE IN NOV.

Parks and Wildlife Department ziologists have finished their deer census work and antlerless deer permits for the forthcoming season will be available to land owners in Coke County on Nov. 3 and 4 at the County Courthouse in Robert

Wildlife officials at the P&WD urge land owners to pick up their permits at the designated place and time since the officials will be on hand to answer questions they may have regarding the new permit system and issuance rate.

Permits this year are based on current deer censuses by designated compartments in the county. Maps outlining the compartments and rates of issuance will be available to the public at the county Courthouse prior to the issuance dates.
