## Lynn Gulley, Miss Lackey Gold Star Award Winners

The Coke County 4-H Gold Star selections for 1975 were honored at a district banquet held in San Angelo last week. Winning the high 4-H awards in Coke County were Mary Elaine Lackey, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Kenneth Lackey of Robert Lee, and Lynn Gulley, son of Mr. and Mrs. Bob Gulley of Sanco Route, Robert Lee. The statements read as the Gold Star recipients were recognized are as follows:

Lynn Gulley, Coke County Gold Star Boy of 1975, is active in all phases of 4-H Club work, conducting 17 projects in five years. He was junior club president in 1974, and Future Leaders 4-H Club Council Delegate in 1975. Lynn is a very active member of the livestock judging teams in 1973 and 1975. He has exhibited six cham-

pion animals at the Coke County Stock Show and was champion beef showman in 1973, horse showman in 1974. Lynn has won three county medals, four year pins, and had the District 7 first place junior beef record book in 1974 and 1975. Lynn is active in school events, church and community as

well as being a 4-H Gold Star winner.

Mary Elaine has been an active 4-H'er for eight years. She has carried a varied field of projects including clothing, foods, grooming, home improvement, recreation, judging, money management and junior leadership. Clothing has become Mary Elaine's "first love" in projects even though she does numerous other things.

A few of the learning skills she considers as important are tailoring collars and lapels, using decorative trims, how to make patch and set in pockets, to finish a hem, model garments, match plaids, to use interfacings and linings and to make bound buttonholes. Among her honors in clothing have been blue awards in 1968 through 1974. She has won one trip to the State Dress Revue as well as six to District Shows. Besides sewing for herself she helps her mother with some of her clothes. She was a Junior Leader for 14 younger girls.

She has won honors in foods including three blue ribbons and trips to District and she was high point award winner in the Meat Group in 1972.

Among the other accomplishments of Mary Elaine have been recreation leader at Fun Day, she has helped judge clothing record books, attended District 4-H Leadership Camp, served as Junior Leader for 12 youths in foods, exhibited at County Fair, served as club secretary, assisted with Pancake Supper, Polio Drive, raised funds for 4-H Center and served on the County 4-H Council.

In school and community she has been very active. She has spent many hours reading to a blind resident in the Nursing Home, playing the piano, and playing games with the elderly. Mary Elaine has served in many ways in the Robert Lee Baptist Church, and in school activities.

Her parents have cooperated in 4-H activities. Mrs. Lackey was recognized in 1974 as the outstanding adult leader for Coke County. The Lackeys have one son, David.

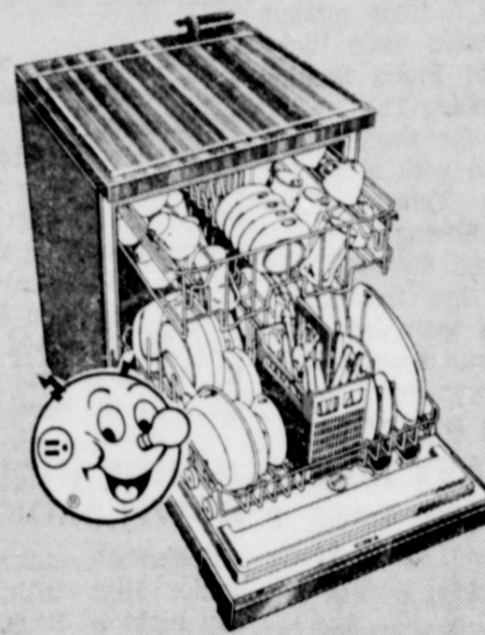

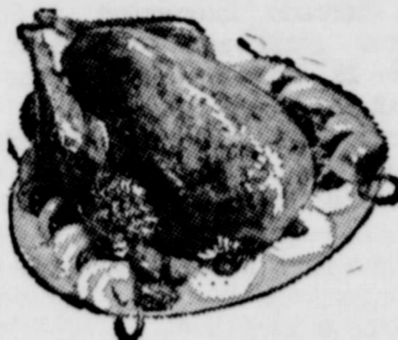

# Eldorado Outlasts Steers, 20-12

Turnovers were the vital difference in the ball game here last Friday night when the Eldorado Eagles downed the Robert Lee Steers 20 to 12. It seemed that every time the Steers got the ball they turned it over.

The defense was excellent, but they couldn't play the entire game, so that was the difference. On the brighter side, the comparison of last year with practically the same ball clubs, the Steers won two more games, gained 330 yards more rushing, tossed the ball for 413 yards more passing and passed the ball for six touchdowns to none last year. The Steers were shut out seven times last year but only twice this year. They scored 100 points to 32 last year. So that's quite an accomplishment in itself. Now that the season is over we can just dream of next year for better or worse.

## First Quarter

Eldorado received the opening kickoff by Shell Williams that carried to the end zone. The ball was brought out to the 20 and the Steers held at the 27. Eldorado punted to the Steers 38 where it was fumbled and Eldorado recovered. The Eagles made a 1st at the Steer 21 and the Steers held on downs at the 17. The Steers moved to their 32 for

a 1st and then for another at their 43. Eldorado then intercepted a pass and returned the Steer 32. They made a 1st on the 21 and then down to the 1. From there they completed a pass in the end zone for their first TD. The PAT failed and the score was 6 to 0.

The Steers received the kickoff at the 15 and returned to their 38 as the first quarter ended.

## Second Quarter

Eldorado intercepted a Steer pass again and returned it to the 28. They made a 1st at the 11, but the Steers were tough on defense and held at the 5. The Robert Lee boys moved up to the 20 for a 1st, but the Eagles held and Williams punted to the Eagle 35. The Steers held at the Eagle 36 and the Eagle punter kicked the ball to the Steer 9 yard line.

Eldorado held the Steers for little and Williams kicked to the Steer 37 where Eldorado fumbled and Mike Perciful recovered for the Steers. They proceeded to make a 1st on the Eagle 45. From the 42 a halfback pass from George Abalos to Jim Craig who made an outstanding catch at the 20 and went the rest of the way for pay dirt. The try for extras failed and the score was 6 to 6.

Eldorado received the kickoff on their 15 and returned to the 39. The Steers drew a penalty to their 41, and on the first play a long pass went for another Eagle TD, but it was called back for holding. The ball was on the 50 yard line as the first half ended.

## Third Quarter

The Steers received the kickoff at the 10 and returned to the 33, but then they drew a penalty which moved them back to the 13. Eldorado allowed little gain and Williams punted to the 50 with a return to the Steer 39. Eldorado went for 1st down on the 24, then to the 11. From there they made another touchdown. They ran the extra points and the score was 14 to 6.

The Steers received the kickoff at the 20 with a return only to the 28, with a near fumble. Eldorado intercepted another pass at the Steer 30. The Eagles moved the ball to the 1 in two 1st down plays and they scored again. The extras failed and it was 20 to 6.

The Steers received the kickoff at the 15 and Terry Ross made a long gainer when he returned it to the Steer 47. The Steers then put on a fantastic drive with Poly Abalos carrying every play behind outstanding blocking down to the Eagle 4 as the third quarter ended.

## Fourth Quarter

In two plays Poly Abalos car-

ried over from the 1. The EP try was no good and the score was 20 to 12. Eldorado got the ball on the 20 after Williams' kickoff went into the end zone. They made a 1st at the 35, then the Steers held and they punted to the Steer 30 with a return to the Eagle 41.

The Steers started another drive that went to the Eagle 10 where Eldorado held on downs. Eldorado gained a 1st on their 22 where the Steers held and they punted to the Steer 30 with a return to the 36. Eldorado then intercepted another Steer pass, this time at the Eagle 30. The Eagles then proceeded to run out the clock and the ball was on the Steer 31 yard line when the final gun sounded. The score was 20 to 12.

### NOTICE OF INTENT TO ENGAGE IN WEATHER MODIFICATION ACTIVITIES

Notice is hereby given that the Colorado River Municipal Water District, 400 East 24th Street, Big Spring, Texas 79720, who holds License No. 76-5 of the State of Texas, issued December 18, 1974, and renewed September 1, 1975, intends to engage in an operation to change or attempt to change by artificial methods the natural development of atmospheric cloud forms for and on behalf of the Colorado River Municipal Water District, P. O. Box 869, Big Spring, Texas 79720, and will conduct the program of weather modification designed to increase precipitation by means of the aerial application of silver iodide or other artificial nuclei as follows:

1. The area over, or within which, equipment may be operated shall include the counties of Lynn, Garza, Kent, Dawson, Borden, Scurry, Fisher, Martin, Howard, Mitchell, Nolan, Glasscock, Sterling and Coke.

2. The target area, within which the precipitation is intended to be enhanced, can be described as follows:

The boundary may be described by a line beginning at a point of origin at Big Spring, Texas, and running along Highway 87 in a northwesterly direction to Lamesa, thence north-northeast on Highway 87 to the north border of Dawson County, thence east along the north border of Dawson, Borden and Scurry Counties to Highway 84; thence southeast along Highway 84 to Roscoe, in Nolan County; thence south-southeast to Maryneal; thence southwest to Silver in Coke County; thence

south-southwest to Highway 87 at a point approximately 13 miles northwest of Sterling City; thence northwesterly along Highway 87 to the point of origin at Big Spring, Texas.

3. The materials, equipment and methods to be used in conducting the operation within this area of approximately 3500 square miles include a 3 cm radar system, cloud seeding aircraft, and the application of silver iodide ice, nuclei hygroscopic nuclei or other nuclei considered appropriate to the artificial nucleation of clouds or weather systems.

4. The person in charge of this program shall be Owen H. Ivie, Colorado River Municipal Water District, Big Spring, Texas.

5. The program will be operational during the period from March 1st to November 30 during the years 1976, 1977, 1978 and 1979.

6. Any persons who feel they may be affected in some adverse way by this program may file a complaint with the Texas Water

Development Board, P. O. Box 13087, Capitol Station, Austin, Texas 78711.

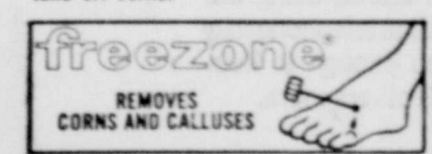

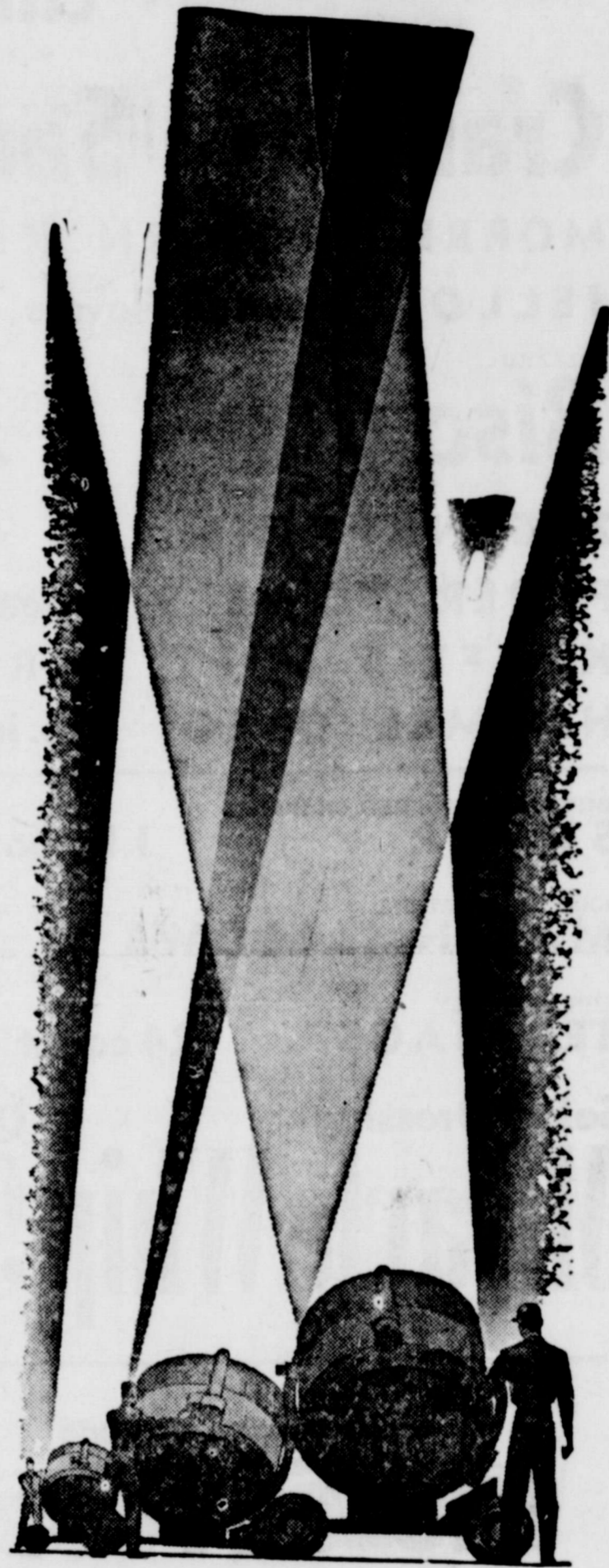
