Robert Lee, Eldorado Girls Finish Season Deadlocked

The Eldorado High School girls slipped by Robert Lee by one point Tuesday night on Eldorado Court to tie the district lead with both teams standing now 9-1. The Eldorado win came after the teams went into two overtimes. In the first half of district play Robert Lee won over Eldorado with a 45-34 score but fell 55-54 in Tuesday night's game. Ronnie Ruff is coach for the Robert Lee girls.

The local lasses 55-39 defeat over Menard last Friday at Menard put RL at a 9.0 district lead as they went up against Eldorado. A play-off game will be played to determine the District 9A Championship.

Tuesday night's game proved to be an exciting one with the score being close throughout the entire game. At the end of the first quarter play RL led 14-12 but as the second quarter action began Eldorado tied it 14-14. RL took the

lead again and were still ahead of the Eldorado lasses at half-time when the scoreboard read RL 29, Eldorado 27.

In the first minute of the third quarter Eldorado tied the score and then went ahead of RL and maintained the lead until, with 29 seconds remaining, RL tied the score and it was 41-41 at the end

of third quarter play. RL took the lead again as 4th quarter play got underway and stayed in the lead until Eldorado tied up the game 51-51 with 1:48 time left on the clock and time ran out with neither team able to sink winning points thus they went into overtime.

No scores were made in the first overtime play and as the clock showed 2:22 minutes in the second OT, RL went ahead 52-51 and with 51 seconds left to play RL brought

the lead to 54-51. With the clock down to 37 seconds, Eldorado hit for 2 bringing the score to 54-53 and with 23 seconds left, hit again for 2 giving them the 55-54 victory.

The Steers are now working out for the upcoming track events.

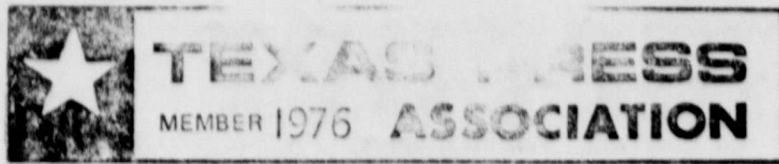

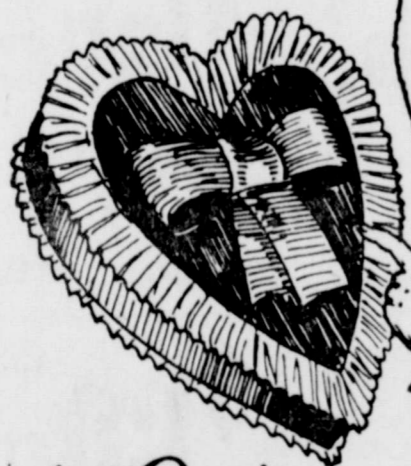

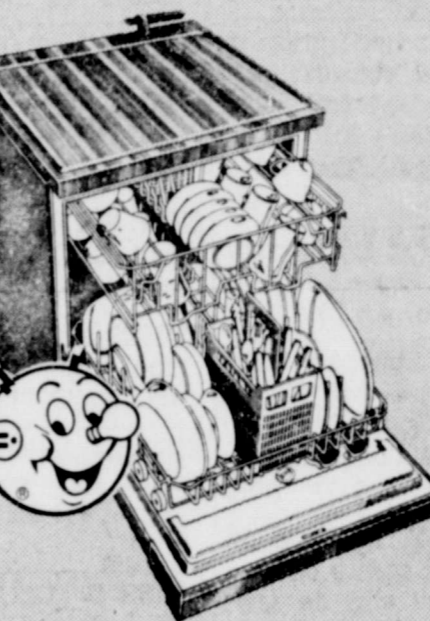
