





#### COMMISSION HAS TOUR OF HOMES IN WEST COKE

The Coke County Historical Commission sponsored a tour called "Evolution of Homes" on Sunday afternon March 21. The group met at 2:00 p.m. on the square at the Courthouse and boarded a toward "Old Edith."

The first stop was Dripping Springs where the load of 23 persons dismounted to see cool running water over solid rock after all these months of drouth.

Jessie Yarbrough pointed out old homesteads, names and dates to the interest of other old timers who could agree and add to her information.

Other stops were:

Old Stewart House, built of limestone in 1883, now abandoned many years.






