Livestock Show Set for January 3rd

The 1977 Coke County Livestock Show will be held at the Recreation and Show Center in Robert Lee Park Monday, Jan. 3. The 1977 edition will be the largest ever, with 97 4-H club and FFA Chapter members competing for honors in the various divisions.

A total of 230 animals have been entered with young people competing for the some 10 ribbons and rosettes, 21 trophies and 100 in prize money.

The sale to follow the completion of the showing is expected to gross \$3800 in premium money for the exhibitors. Each exhibitor will be allowed to sell the animal in the premium sale.

The show will get underway Monday at 8:30 a.m. with the showing of breeding swine.

Market swine, market lambs, market steers and breeding cattle will follow in the order listed. The auction is scheduled to begin at 3 p.m., immediately after the completion of the show and awarding of trophies.

Judge for the 1977 show will be Wilburn Key, County Extension Agent, Mason County. He will be assisted in the ring by the county new directors, serving

as division superintendents. D. J. Walker, Jr., chairman of the show association board of directors, will be announcer for the show. Frank Brownfield, vocational agriculture teacher at Colorado City, will classify lambs for the show.

Jerry Gibbs, Robert Lee High School principal, will serve as show clerk. The sale will be under the direction of Ed Cumbie of Bronte, who will serve as auctioneer.

Coke County Home Demonstration Clubs will serve barbecue lunches in the adjacent recreation center. Everyone is invited to attend the 1977 Show and have lunch with the club women.

Robert Lee and Bronte Schools will be dismissed Monday to allow students to participate in the annual Coke County Livestock Show.



Fires a Special Hazard During Christmas Time

Citizens of Coke County and the surrounding areas have been warned by officials of the Robert Lee and Bronte Volunteer Departments to exercise extra caution in preventing fires during the Christmas holidays.

Christmas trees and wrappings from gift packages are especially vulnerable to outbreaks of fire.

Lighted candles should never be placed on, nor even close to Christmas trees. Electric lights used to decorate trees should be checked out carefully before they are placed on the trees. Any strings of lights that are frayed or damaged should be replaced with new ones.

Christmas wrappings should be gathered up and disposed of as soon as possible after gift

packages are unwrapped. Loose paper all around a room is a good target for a fire, especially when persons are smoking while opening gifts.

One fire department official said, "We don't want to be out fighting fires Christmas Day, but most of all we would hate to see some family's Christmas marred with a fire in the home."

"Extra care and common sense should prevent such a tragedy from happening," the firemen added.

Q: What are the facts on holiday driving hazards?

A: Read what the pros have to say.

Q What about those icy bridges in Texas?

A Avoid sudden braking or steering movements, as either can trigger a skid. Let up on the gas and keep the steering wheel as steady as possible to maintain maximum traction.

Q What if a car does begin skidding?

A Don't slam on the brakes, that only makes a skid worse. Let up on the gas and steer into the skid until you regain control. Don't panic or over-correct; skids can be controlled.

Q Doesn't this technique conflict with our automatic responses?

A We do have a tendency to hit the brakes in an emergency. This is often the worst thing to do, especially in winter driving situations. Anticipating dangers and skillful steering will get you out of most hazards. It's a good idea to build confidence through practice. Find an empty parking lot on an icy day, and explore how steering into a skid feels and works.

Q What is "hydroplaning"?

A You are driving at 50-55 mph on a rainy day when suddenly your car feels like it is floating. This happens because even with tire tread good enough to pass state inspection, at the right speed on a wet roadway your tires can release the road surface and begin running on the thin skim of water coating the highway.

Q What can be done about it?

A Let up on the gas and slow down. Hydroplaning is a combination of speed and a wet surface. By diminishing speed, your tires will regain contact with the road.

Q What can I do to improve bad weather visibility?

A Freezing conditions can make windshield wiper blades hard and brittle. Check them regularly, especially in the winter.

Q What about my lights?

A Use them, even if it is daytime, in bad weather. Make sure other drivers can see you. For the same reason, be generous in signaling. Texas law requires you to signal even when changing lanes.

Q How do I avoid being blinded by my own headlights in bad weather?

A Rely on your low beams in fog, snow and rain. High beams reflect off precipitation to actually reduce visibility. And be careful not to overdrive your headlights.

Q Any other winter driving pointers?

A Remember that carbon monoxide, a deadly gas, can build up inside a closed vehicle. Open a window occasionally to ventilate the car.

Q What is the importance of "speed differential"?

A Minimizing the difference in speed between cars helps reduce potential conflicts. In highway driving, the safest technique is to keep a proper interval and "go with the flow."

Q Just what is the right interval between cars?

A The easiest rule of thumb is to allow at least two seconds between you and the car ahead. Count it off as the vehicle passes a fixed object. Of course, in bad weather you should lengthen the interval.

Q What about safety belts? Do they really make a difference?

A Safety belts are especially important when confronting the hazards of winter driving. In an accident they keep you from being thrown from the car, thus increasing your chances of survival five-fold.

Q How much drinking does it take to affect driving?

A Under Texas law, you are presumed to be a drunken driver if your blood alcohol level is above .10. A 120-pound woman enjoying two mixed drinks in an hour probably has a blood alcohol concentration of .11.

Q How often should I take a break while driving?

A Every two hours. Texas has an excellent system of rest stops. Don't become glued to the steering wheel in a battle with the clock. Relaxing for 15 minutes, even trading drivers if possible, makes the trip safer and more pleasant.

Q How else can I fight "highway hypnosis"?

A Avoid staring at a fixed point, such as at the road just in front of you. Keep your eyes moving. Glance at your mirrors. Check what is going on down the highway in the distance. You can often see trouble developing a long way off.

Q What is a major cause of accidents on holiday trips?

A Lack of preparation. Holiday drivers frequently start off on trips of 500 miles or more under the worst conditions possible.

Q Could you explain?

A Here is a typical example. The family stays up late the night before packing. Then one or both parents rush home after working all day to gulp down a meal, load the car and take off into the night. What professional driver would want to risk his life on the highway under those conditions?

Q What is a safer alternative?

A Don't take the trip for granted; plan adequately. Calculate how long it will take to get there and back, and then add in extra time for bad weather or other delays.

Q Any other special advice for families traveling during the holidays?

A Make sure your children have something to occupy their time so they do not distract the driver. A good technique is to keep aside special toys, games and books for the kids to use only in the car.

Q How about "backseat driving"?

A Take advantage of it on your next trip. Even if your companion does not drive, think of him or her as copilot and navigator. Two pairs of eyes can see more driving hazards than one, especially at night. Adequate maps and a guidebook to sights along the way can breathe life into what otherwise might be a humdrum holiday trip.

HAPPY HOLIDAYS WITH CRANBERRIES

Cranberries can say Happy Holidays in a lot of ways other than being served up with the turkey at holiday meals. They invite lavish use, now that they are coming to market in such abundant supply.

This year's crop will surpass last year's by 300,000 barrels. The total crop will reach 2.4 million barrels.

Explore the use of cranberries in cakes, cookies, and even pies for giving or eating. Their tart taste and fine color will help enhance the magic of Christmas.

Use cranberry juice,

hot or cold, for a variety of punch recipes. Or, freeze the juice into ice cubes and float them in your favorite punch.

If your Christmas tree runs to the old fashioned, string cranberries and encircle your tree. Alternate them on the string with popcorn for a color variation.

Cranberry Refrigerator Cake

- 2 cups fresh or frozen cranberries, chopped
- 1 large banana, diced
- 2/3 cup granulated sugar
- 2 cups crushed vanilla wafers
- 1/2 cup margarine or butter
- 1 cup confectioners sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1/2 cup chopped nuts
- 1 cup whipping cream

Mix together chopped cranberries, banana and granulated sugar. Set aside while you prepare rest of recipe. Place one-half of the crushed vanilla wafers in the bottom of 8 x 8" pan. Cream margarine and confectioners sugar together, add eggs and beat well. Spread this mixture over the crumbs. Now top with a layer of the cranberry-banana mixture and sprinkle with the chopped nuts. Whip the cream until it peaks and spread over the cranberries and nuts. Cover all with remaining crushed wafers and chill at least 4 hours before serving. The best flavor results if chilled overnight. Serves 9-12 depending on size of piece.

You can keep your freshly cut fruits looking their best on a buffet platters by dipping them in orange or lemon juice. To avoid a last-minuted rush, prepare and treat bananas, pears and apples ahead of time, then chill.

Pears have a place in your diet. Low in calories and with no acidity, they are easy to digest and ideal for weight-watchers.

New Tax Permits Being Sent Out By Comptroller

Comptroller Bob Bullock asked Texas retailers Monday to be on the lookout for new state sales and use tax permits that should be arriving in the mail later this month.

Bullock said his office is issuing new permits to the 290,931 holders of the "Limited Sales Tax Permit" and the 4,594 holders of the "Texas Use Tax Certificate." The new permits are scheduled to be mailed December 10, he said.

Because of the Christmas mail rush, however, he said retailers should not be alarmed if the new permit arrives late in the month.

The Comptroller said the new gold-colored permits will replace all existing green permits, which will then become void.

Only those retailers currently holding valid permits will receive a new one, Bullock emphasized. "Those businesses which have become delinquent and have had their permit suspended will not get a new permit until they pay up," he said.

He reminded all retailers that law requires the permits to be prominently displayed in their place of business.

Term insurance is protection for a certain (limited) period of time which usually may be renewed for another period of time or converted to permanent insurance... provided you and your agent arranged for this privilege when you bought the policy. Permanent insurance will last as long as you want it and will accumulate cash value and paid-up values... which may later be used as cash or collateral. Although term insurance costs less in premiums the policy will expire after its term... unless renewed. Since term does not accumulate cash value or paid-up values, many feel, while cheaper in the short run, it is more expensive in the long run and when possible provisions should be made to convert it to permanent insurance.

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


