The hearing held at Roswell, as mentioned in the letter to Mr. Carter, should be attended by a delegation of business men from Roosevelt County for the purpose of bringing to the attention of the commission the true facts of the matter of rates charged by the rail road company. Mr. Caater has written to the chair. man of the commission to the effect that Roosevelt County will, in all probability, send represenatives to Roswell to appear before the officers on the date set for the hearing, and is working on the proposition.

If a good showing is made of the excessive charges made in this state, the Commission should make some strict regulations for the protection of shippers




