## Alfalfa Plantin

There will be considerable land months. Alfa line of preparing the seed-bed help the farmer to obtain a good stand. The recessity of preparing the land properly before the seed is sown cannot be strongly for one sha not expect to secure s good stand of alfalfa if the land is poorly leveled and the cods left unbro ken. The farmer who spends time and capital in the preparation of his seed-bed is the one on his land.
In the first place see that the land is level; that is to say, have the field such a shape that the waer when irrigating at a uniform depth over the entire plat or bor-
der.. The danger of $*$ killing the the alfalfa by too much water in the low places is thereby elimi nated.

There are no tixed rules to fol low in levelening a piece of land

cultivation it is well to seed the landto an annual crop such as and in this way determine wheth er or not the land is level It
will alwayspe found that the land will need re-leveling, dragging

low. ones. However, if it is es. sential that the alfalfa be seeded the first year, the land should be
bordered before seeding and irrigated, and the levelness of the may be applied again where ne
