 The second session of the first state legislature of New Mexico came to an end Friday at noon. The legislature this year was the scene of introduction of some 560 bills, with forty joint resolu tions and memorials in addition. Of these, 212 bilis appeared in the senate and 353 in the house. ## Planting of Cabbage

The cabbage is a cool weather plant and does much better
during the cooler season of the during the cooler season of the
year than at any other time; and the market is also better. The cabbage does not grow very fas
during the cold weather of during the cold weather of, as they produce so many leaves and are heavy feeders.
It has been found that the
earlier the early cabbage can b transplanted the better, for this gives a start of the aphis which
sometimes do sometimes do a great deal of
damage to the cabbage. In the warmer parts of the state the first of March is a good time to transplant the cabbage from the cold frames to the field, and as it
takes about two months for the cabbage to grow to good trans planting size, the seed should be
sown about the first of January in the coldframes. For places seed should be sown from the
