In the construc tion of this latter or thicker ce al form is required to hold the al form is required to hold the This form need not be over three feet high, which requires that the wall be constructed in sections of three,feet each. Under
this metnod the bottom section is made first, and then the'form is moved up three feet, and so on,
until the top shall be reached. In order to save necessity for scaffolding for the thin or plastered wall, the cement should be applied at the time of digging the silo, beginning at the top and going downward as the excava or paint the wall with pure ce ment and water
