There's a farmer in the shall low water belt near Portales that Some of Mr. Long's recent has 40 acres under irrigation. On this small farm he raises al-Texas. At each place he was falfa and keeps seventy Durocinstrumental in the erection of Jersey brood sows each of which produces a litter of pigs three times a year. For these pigs the farmer receives from \$3.50 to \$5 each as soon as they are big enough to wean. Suppose each sow brings six pigs at a clip (which is a low estimate) and raises 12 out of 18 until they are big enough to sell. 12 times 70 is 840. Suppose these pigs average \$4 apiece and you will have \$3360 for the year's crop of pigs.

> Besides raising pigs and al falfa this farmer grows cantaloupes of a choice variety which he readily finds a market for. It can readily be seen that De produces at least \$4000 worth of stuff on his little farm of 40 acres each year.

Before someone discovered that an abundance of artesian water flowed underwenth the ground in this region, the land was not worth \$2 an acre/now it

The valley about Portales is being developed for a distance of many miles in every direction. The water in the wells rises to a distance of 20 feet from the surface, being in fact semi-artesian. The water is pumped up either by private plants or by a large electric pumping plant, situated in Portales.

Information on Silage

If a larger per cent of the feed raised in New Mexico were put into silos and fed to live stock, especially dairy cattle it would undoubtedly be one of the greatfactors in settling up and improving the country. At present in the dry farming sections many silos are being dug in the ground and they serve the purpose very well, where the person has no money tobuild one above ground. New Mexico produces a great variety of crops, both in the dry and irrigated farming sections, that make excellent silage.

Kaffir and Milo-Just as corn stands preeminent as a silo crop in the Corn Belt States, the nonsaccharine sorghums kaffir, milo and feterita undoubtably are the leading crops in the southwest. In most parts of New Mexico corn does not produce as well as the above crops, and its advantages are not sufficient to war rant planting it for silage crops in preference to ones that are better adapted to our condition. Because of a great amount of carbohydrates in cane, milo the silage is apt to be a little sour. By letting the cane ghums. get a litting the cane get a little more mature, thus allowing more of the starch to change to sugar before it is cut, less acid will develop and a very good quality of silage will be produced. Soule of the Kentucky Station, after feeding it for five years, says that it should be cut just short of maturity.

When a crop is planted for the silo it is much better to choose some one of the above, because of the larger yield per acre and of the superior quality of the silage; but there are a great many other crops that are successfully raised in New Mexico and have been proved to make very good silage. The larger part of the feeds that must be fed with silage in this country are of a nitrogenous character, and on this account it is also preferable to use a car-

bonaceous crop for the silo. Alfalfa. Of course there is no advantage in putting alfalfa into the silo if it can be made into first-class hay. > Roots. As for the root crops, there is nothing gained by putting them into a silo, as they can be preserved or covered over in holes dug in the ground and when fed in this way make just as good feed.

Rape. This crop is not proven to be a success, as the stalks are too watery, causing it to sour and also to decay more or less.

Russian Thistle. As this weed is so persistent in some sections great many attempts have been made to utilize it in some way. It has been tried to some extent in the silo, but the best that can be said for it is that it furnishes a means of subsistence to animals during a time of drought or scarcity of feed. Where a person has not enough of the other crops to fill his sile or can dig a very cheap silo in the ground, he can utilize quite a large amount of the thistles and if cut when green and juicy, before the thorns are hardened, he has done a great deal toward eradicating them from the farm, and at the same time has a feed that will maintain stock. 

Millet, The different kinds of millet may under some conditions be put into the silo, but no data seem to be available that would prove it to be imporant as a silo crop. A great many by-products can very profitably be used for siloing where they are available, and someof them make very valuable additions to the ration when properly preserved.
