The People of the United States Are a Liberty Loving People and Have Always Appreciated Justice

WE WISH ALL A SAFE AND SANE FOURTH OF JULY

American People Have Held Fourth of July Sacred and the Lapse of Years Have Not Changed Them

One hundred and thirty-seven years ago, Friday, the declaration of independence was signed by the colonist, declaring "that these united colonies are, and ought to be, free and independent states, that they are absolved from all allegiance to the British crown, and that all political connection between them and the states of Great Britain is, and ought to be, totally dissolved."

Prior to the signing of the declaration of independence, in the spring of 1776 Richard Henry Lee, of Virginia, moved "that these united colonies are, and of right ought to be, free and independent states." Thomas Jefferson the declaration and it contains, among other statements, the following which is dear to the heart of every normal man:

"That all men are created free and equal that they are endowed by their creator with certain inalienable rights; that among these are life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness."

Because the people of the United States have always been a liberty-loving people, and have ever appreciated justice and right, they have ever held sacred the fourth day of July. And, with the lapse of years it has lost none of its sacredness. It is still the "Glorious Fourth." It is a monument dear to our hearts because the thing that it commemorates is dear to our hearts; life, liberty, justice.

The Herald wishes it great host of readers the "best ever fourth." But in all of your hilarity, keep sane and thereby make this a sane fourth of July.
