1 st. Because it will be organized and operated on strict business lines. There will be no inflated stock, no water in stock, every dollar invested in stock will be put into the creamery.
2nd. Because it will pay good dividends; 12 per cent is good dividends, it will therefore be a good investment.
3rd. Because the purchase of stock in this creamery will help local business and make our community stronger financially.
4th. Because a successful creamery will make a good cash market for cream, and a steady market for every farmer; enable the farmer to get from $\mathbf{2 5}$ to $\mathbf{3 0}$ per cent more for his cream, buy for cash at the stores. This creamery will turn into this county from $\$ 3,500$ to $\$ 8,000$ per month cash. There is enough cream going out of Roosevelt county right now to make 1000 lbs of butter per day. A creamery is essentially a farmer's enterprise. All profits go back to the farmers. By all means investigate this matter. See the data gathered; attend some of the meetings being held.
