I consider the cowman on the on the grass in the deep water and the farmer in the shallow water of Roosevelt county, have the best thing going if we will pull together.

If each eighty acres in the valley had crops for ensilage and alfalfa and given plenty of water they could carry two hundred cows on good feed from December 1, until grass, say 125 days for feed and care and take them through in good shape past the critical time of calving the early calves, it is the early calves that bring the money, and probably give a ten per cent better calf crop, give them a good start on grass; this may seem high for wintering a cow but if she is the right kind of an animal watch her pay for it and a good sum for trips, Frank Smith returned to profit.


