The result of the bond election is now regarded as certain, the proposition having greatly grown in public favor as the people have come to understand it. Let us roll up a large majority and then form a solid line to build a greater Portales. We have the territory and the resources There is good promise of another line of railroad which would mean much to this town and the country around it. Some public spirited and enterprising citizens are proposing a gigantic irrigation scheme for the whole Portales valley to be backed by the Government. We will discuss that in detail next week.

#### The School Tax.

Next Tuesday this scoool district will vote on a ten mill tax for its schools. This is a matter that ought not to escape the at tention of citizens and tax payers. It is the opportunity to say Our Pleasure whether our schools shall be come an object of public pride meeting in an adequate way our needs or whether they shall continue with disgracefully short terms, inadequate equipment and poorly paid teachers. Seven months, the length of this year's term, is too short a period for any force of teachers to accomplish the work commonly desig nated for modern public schools. This is especially true of the work laid out for grammar and high school grades. We must have longer terms or confess that our schools belong to the third rate class Our teachers are poorly paid. Besides the two men engaged in the school here in Portales there are nine teachers employed in this district all of whom work at the pitably small salary of fifty dollars per month. This year these young ladies have been forced to do their own janitor work to save the common treas ury. They protest loudly against such poor pay and overwork and their protest is a just one. It is a question not to be overlooked whether we can at all hope to retain the services of such competent teachers at this low rate of pay. The tax will put about \$3500 into the funds of the district and this amount will give us a term of nine or ten months and will put our teachers on decent pay Better pay always means bet ter work, even our teachers not being an exception, and longer terms will mean more work. A proper concern for our public schools together with an understanding of their crying needs ought to impel every qualified voter to register himself in favor of the ten mill tax.
