Local Uption at Satita Fe That Local Option fightover at Santa Fe is assuming national proportions. The beginning of the scrap was when the Women's Christian Temperance Union secured the passage of an ordinance by the Santa Fe city coun cil, giving the saloons a time lim it of December first to get out of business. The booze men
contended that the people did contended that the people did closed, and sought to have the ordinance repealed. The city council then called an election to let the people vote on the mat ter. The saloon men, backed up
by the Albuquerque "Personal by the Albuquerque "Personal
Liberty League," sought aid of Attorney General Clancy and Governor Curry by the injuaction route, their contention then being that the council had no right to use city funds for de raying the expenses of the elec tion. The W. C. T. U. saw their bluff and also raised the bet by promptly putting up the funds
to pay for the election, showing to pay for the election, showing at the same time that the city
had no funds, and that it was an act of charity to both the liquor interests and the city to thus provide the sinews of war. It is reported on good authority that the Governor informed the "Per sonal" etc., people that under the
circumstances, he would not only interfere with the election only interfere with the election
