DRY FARMING PROGRESS '09.
H. B. Henning, Secretary Territorial Board of Immigration Tells of Accomplishments of Conservationists.

The year 1909 has been the
most important in the history of most important in the history of
New Mexico, from the standpoint New Mexico, from the standpoint of development of agricultural resources. The year's develop ment, has brought mnder culu-
vation not less than 200,000 acres of raw land, while approximately double that acreage has been laid out for cultivation during 1910 .
of this very considerable total, about two thirds has been and will be dry farming land. Con-
struction has begun on a number struction has begun on a number of important irrigation projects, which in the aggregate will re claim many thousands of acres
These, however, are still in the These, however, are still in the
development stage, while the dry farming lands are producing. Without any accurate statistics available as to actual yields it is
difficult to give any very close difficult to give any very close
estimate of what the year's development of dry farming lands has added to the permanen value and wealth production of securing such an estimate to glance over the dry farming o glance over the dry
districts of the territory and see the development which has oc curred in the centers of popula tion, which exist because of the surrounding farms.
East of Las Vegas, there lies a
vast tract of mesa, or table lands vast tract of mesa, or table lands
which are ideal dry farming lands. Three years ago these lands were leasing slowly at $\$ 5$ an acre. At the recent land show represented by no less than half
a dozen companies, all of whom are engaged in taking people to
the same Five dollar lands, now worth easily $\$ 15$ dollars an acre
and up. The city of Las Vegas has felt the influence of the de mand for these lands, and the in-
fluence is shown in increasing the valuation of town property, Three years ago where the stands, there was nothing but Clovis had only a depot. It didn't even have a water tank. Now
Clovis has 5000 people, big school building, electric lights, water
works, sewer system and a street car line in mrospect.
