A. L. Chesher of Portales, N. M., who rode the plains of that territory, and that of west Texas for 30 years, says it is a very easy matter to note the gradual disappearance of the cattle from that great range territory. Mr. Chesher says it is not necessary STATEMENT FROM J. RYTHER, to go back a generation to find facts and figures to prove the statement that cattle are growing fewer.

"Seven years ago," remarked Mr. Chesher with emphasis, "I sold yearling steers for \$13 per head. Today the same kind of steers would very readily bring \$27. The best 4 year old steers then could be bought for \$25, and now they sell for \$45 and \$50 This fall yearling heifers sold out on the range at \$25 each. Seven years ago they could be had for less than half that amount. Think of selling calves this fall at \$16 to \$20 each out there on the range. If we had as many cattle as usual, no such prices would be paid, you can bet your last dollar on that. Right now steers bring as much out in the range territory as they would on the Kansas City market."-Kansas City Drovers Telegram.
