More than a thousand Italians have gone back to their native land from America, arriving at Rome July 22. The authorities there fear that a cessation in the demand for unskilled labor in this country has set in.

Last week a flood of postal cards commenced to pour in on President Roosevelt urging him to reconsider his declaration of 1904 and accept another nomination for the presidency. The postal cards bear a picture of the "White House," under which is the inscription, "Uncle Sam Will Renew the Lease."

At Madrid, New Mexico, a boy five years of age, got lost in the hills and was out three days and nights before he was found. The boy was the son of Joe Guilani, a coal miner. Practically everyone in the community joined in the search, a two hundred dollar reward being offered. When found, the boy was more dead than alive, but is recovering all right.

Roosevelt county has been settled rapidly during the past year. This fact is borne out by the creation within that period of about forty new school districts, as is noted in the annual report of the county superintendent of schools to the territorial department of education. There are now nearly one hundred school districts in Roosevelt county. Special tax levies have already been made in most, if not all, of the districts for school purposes, including the erection of school houses .-Santa Fe New Mexican.

Referee Safford has recently made a report in the case in which Hon. H. O. Bursom was suing for an accounting between the territory and himself, regarding the financial affairs of the penitentiary during the time he was superintendent. The report completely exhonerates Mr. Bursom and shows that the territory will have to pay back to the former superintendent the money which he paid, under protest, to cover alleged shortage. 
