Prof. Wheeler intends to teach in Texas the coming year. The professor is an interesting talker and all would be pleased to hear him talk on any subject.

Prof. Osborn, the new superintendent for Portales, has not shown up yet at the institute. We are informed that he is attending the normal at Roswell.

Many of the teachers are much disappointed in Prof. Fairly's persisting in remaining away from the normal. His presence occasionally would be much appreciated.

Miss Somers is one of our most interesting lady pedagogs and is the leader of the discussion from the ladies side and is certainly an entertaining and instructive speaker.

Prof. McDonald, principal of Texico, formerly of Oklahoma, by his suggestions greatly assist the instructors and tends to increase the interest in the work of the institute.

A. C. Thorp and brother, from Black-tower, take quite a prominent part in most discussions. They came from Missouri and remember their native state well along with Prof. Brown.

W. G. Russell, one of the professors for next year in Portales, is taking a prominent part, and in the discussion on civil government gave a most interesting and intelligent talk on citizenship.

We are informed that Mr. Dobbs, a member of the school board, and Dr. Pearce, ex-county superintendent, are thinking of treating the assembled teachers to ice cream soda. The teachers, so far, have been anxiously watching the banks.

The normal this year, compared with previous years, is a vast improvement both in attendance and interest. Last year fifty teachers were in attendance; this year eighty. This is a remarkable showing and is certainly a good omen for the future prosperity and growth of Roosevelt county.

The various sections of the United States are well represented. Teachers are here from Ohio, Michigan, Indiana, Georgia, Arkansas, Kansas, Oklahoma, Kentucky, Tennessee, Missouri and Canada. The exchange of ideas by teachers educated and trained in all

parts of the country, is certainly interesting and instructive.

J. F. Chambers, of Michigan, having taught one term in Oklahoma, is now attending normal here and is taking a very conspicuous part. His discussion with C. M. Compton, on local geography, soil, water and natural surroundings, proves Mr. Chambers a close and safe observer and we extend to him a welcome to our New Mexico schools.

A peculiar and revolting mania of crime has broken out in New York City this week, in which women and young girls have been the victims. The frequency of these crimes have caused the people to attempt to take the law in their own hands to wreak vengeance on the criminals. Great excitement prevails.

Governor George Curry passed through Portales Monday on his return to New Mexico from Washington and Oyster Bay, where he had a conference with President Roosevelt. Governor Curry remained in Roswell Tuesday, a formal reception being given him there that night. He went to Santa Fe Wednesday, and Thursday was duly inaugurated governor.

Hats off to Arkansas. She's got a sure thing diamond mine, so pronounced by experts. One hundred and forty diamonds, variously estimated to be worth from \$150,000 to \$200,000, have been found in Pike county since the first of the year. The strata in which they are found is said to be like the famous Kimberly mines in South Africa. Before this information was given out, the property where they were discovered was bought by a syndicate.

The good rains this part of New Mexico has been having the past two weeks makes the farmers feel that a good crop is practically assured. The farming interests here are in fine shape and the development of the country will proceed rapidly. The busy season with the farmers in the east is now abating and prospectors are commencing to arrive now again in greater numbers than they have in the past few months. There will, undoubtedly, be a big immigration into this country this fall.

Last Saturday, at Chicago, Judge Landis, in the U. S. District Court, imposed a fine upon the Standard Oil Company, of Indiana, of \$29,240,000, the maximum amount upon each one of 1,462 counts in the indictment on which that company was recently convicted of rebating. The judge recommended that a call be issued for a special jury to consider the case of the other party to the rebating operations of which the Standard Oil Company was found guilty, and it is therefore probable that within a short time proceedings will be commenced against the Chicago & Alton Railroad Company for the alleged commission of similar offenses. The Standard Oil Company will appeal to the U. S. Circuit Court of Appeals from the sentence imposed by Judge Landis. A later report is that the company will likely pay the fine and make a ten per cent raise in the price of coal oil and the raise may be increased to as much as twenty-five per cent.

**A Story of the Early Days.**  
While the editor of the Times was in Roswell the first of the week, we met a man by the name of W. E. Blanchard, who said he took the United States census of what is now Roosevelt county, and included a part of Chaves county, for the census of 1890, seventeen years ago.  
The district of which he took the census was then a precinct of Eddy county. It comprised a section of this country one hundred miles east and west by fifty north and south, the north boundary being on what is now the north line of Roosevelt county, and the west line was about twenty-five miles west of the Pecos river and extended to the state line of Texas on the east.  
At that time he found one hundred and thirty-two people in the precinct and most of them were Mexicans located over on the west side of the Pecos river. He found ten or twelve ranches out here on the plains. Among these ranches were the DZ's, Boykin's and Stone's. At Portales Springs he said there was a man lived by the name of Doak Good.  
It seems this man Doak Good was quite a noted character in this country at that time and was always in trouble with his neighbors. Mr. Blanchard told us the story of an incident that happened just shortly before he was here taking the census.  
A man who had had some trouble with Doak Good fixed up a plan to kill him. He had slipped up within shooting distance of Good's house and piled up a little semi-circle of rocks, two or three rocks high, just enough so he could lay down behind. Thus concealed, he laid there waiting for Good to come out of his house to shoot him. Good discovered him though and applied different tactics. Good had a frame house and it was quite high, having a gable roof. Good climbed up in his loft and secured a position as high as he could under the roof. Then he carefully cut a hole out through the shingles. This put him in range of his assailant behind the rocks, who was speedily dispatched with a winchester.
