At the start there was much pposition to the Forests. Often this opposition was just; for although Congress had' set apart had made no provision for their use or their protection. The tim ber was simply locked up and left to burn. This mistake was rem passed which made it possible to use all the resources and give them suitable protection.
At first a great many of the National Forests were made with boundary lines should run. This agricultural lands which should have been excluded were taken in, and a good deal of timber land was left out. This could have been avoided by making examinations on the ground, but there so the boundaries had to be drawn very roughly.
