### Farmers Meeting and Poultry Show

Professor Tinsley will Speak Here Thursday, January 28th.

Speaking Will be Held at the Court House and it will be of Great Interest to Farmers.

On Thursday, January 28, 1909, Prof. J. D. Tinsley will deliver a lecture for the purpose of organizing a "Farmer's Institute" at this place. It is the desire of those interested in agricultural pursuits, that all farmers assemble at the court house at 2 o'clock p. m.

Arrangements are also being made to hold a poultry show at about the same time as the Tinsley meeting. The date of the poultry show is January 28, 29 and 30th. All persons desiring to exhibit their poultry can do so free of charge, the only requirement being that the poultry be brought in appropriate coops and be free from disease. A suitable room will be provided in which to hold the show. Those coming from a distance would do well to bring in their poultry on the 27th as we want to make the 28th the big day of the show.

Harry R. Sims of San Miguel county has been appointed receiver of the U. S. Land office at Las Cruces. Mr. Sims was in Portales last fall during the campaign, being a member of the Andrews party.

A cold wave has been sashaying across the north and east, with a fizz end of it striking this portion of New Mexico. While we have had no snow, as close as Amarillo and over most of Texas the ground was covered with the "beautiful" Monday.

A school is to be established by the government to be known as the School of American Archaeology. The capitol city of this territory, Santa Fe, is after the school and is the logical place for its location. The only competitor Santa Fe has is Los Angeles, California.

Roswell, the great city of the Pecos Valley, is trying to parade itself in the latest fashion by securing a commission form of government. They have a bill prepared to submit before the legislature authorizing the adoption of a commission form of government in cities of 4,000 population or more, and when this is passed Roswell wants to be governed that way.

The population of New Jersey has increased only 12 per cent in the last thirty-three years, while insanity has increased more than three hundred per cent, in the same stretch of time in that state. On the other hand, New Mexico's population has increased one hundred per cent the last eight years, and insanity has not kept pace in proportion. Isn't there a good statehood argument in statistics of that kind. — New Mexican.

A news dispatch labeled Boston, says reports from prominent men in state and manufacturing cities indicate their belief that 1909 will be an unusually prosperous year. There is thought to be good luck in the figure nine, it being cited that gold was discovered in California in 49, Pikes Peak discovered in 59, prosperous conditions existed in 69, 79 and 89, and in 99 occurred the opening of the Klondyke and the revival of trade of the Spanish war.

Late reports from Washington are to the effect that separate statehood for Arizona and New Mexico must go over until the Sixty-first Congress, as consideration of the general appropriation bills and other absolutely necessary legislation requires all the time between now and March 4th. Representative Watson of Indiana, who was appointed on the committee on territories, is reported as being opposed to action on statehood at this session, on the ground that there is not sufficient time to consider the subject.

## Pumping Plants to be Established.

The Kansas City Star says that the National Land and Sub-Irrigation Company, with \$3,000,000 capital stock has been organized in Kansas City under the laws of Arizona. It is proposed to install several demonstration stations in New Mexico, Arizona and Colorado, and in general develop the new system of irrigation by means of ordinary drilled wells. The promoters declare that from ten to twenty-five acres can be successfully irrigated from a well that will supply from fifty to one hundred barrels in twenty-four hours. They maintain that water in sufficient quantities can be found almost anywhere in the arid and semi-arid belt, at from fifty to three hundred feet depths, and that sub-irrigation will revolutionize the dam and ditch system now in use.

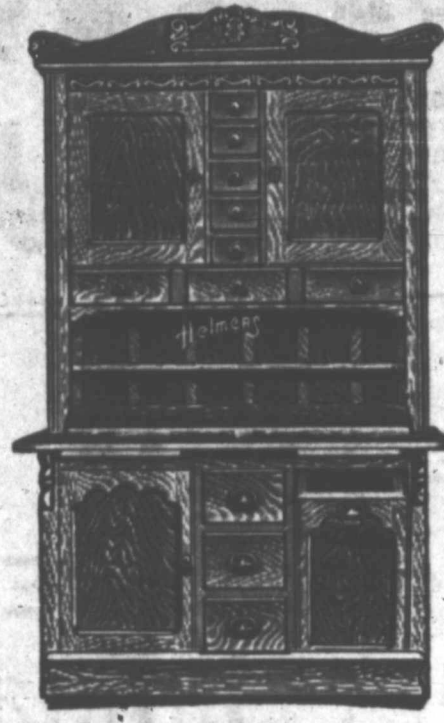
The new organization acquired the patents recently issued to Prof. John L. Wiggins, of Kansas City. His new tilemaking machine, which makes and lays a continuous cement tile, is said to be one of the greatest inventions of the age, and will make from 30,000 to 40,000 feet of tile per day. It mixes the sand and cement, digs the ditch and moves itself along automatically. It is with this machine that the arid West will be made to "bloom like a rose."

Details could not be learned, but it is understood that several hundred farmers will be secured who want lands in the dry belt of New Mexico, and the company will assist them in placing the Wiggins system in operation. The home-seeker will have several years in which to pay for the irrigation plant. Prof. Wiggins, the inventor, stated today that an effort would be made at once to install several sub-irrigation stations in New Mexico, and that during the coming year his new system would be in general use in the fertile valleys and rich mesa lands in the West. He said the Carey Act made it possible for thousands of actual settlers to take up homes in the Southwest, and by his invention tilling could be made and laid at a nominal cost per acre. Heretofore it has cost from 5 to 7 cents per foot to make tile, but by this new process it can be made at from one to three cents per lineal foot.

It is announced that the Atchison, Topeka, and Santa Fe railroad will operate the entire main line from Chicago to the coast by telephone instead of by telegraph. The substitution will be carried on as rapidly as possible. Contracts have been let for the installation of a telephone system between Kansas City and Emporia. As soon as this is completed the work will begin between Kansas City and Chicago. The cost will be \$2,000,000, but the company believes it will insure more safety.

The conviction of murder of eight night riders in Tennessee clears that state of a stigma which was doing it considerable harm in public estimation. A state or any portion of a state where life and property are not protected by the authorities, can not be considered desirable either for the investment of capital or as a residence for decent people. — New Mexican.

### Wilson Family Under Arrest.

From Clovis News:

Special Agent, L. E. Curtright of the Santa Fe system and local officer A. B. Hubbard made a sensational arrest this week of the Wilson family who resided on a claim northwest of town and who are now under bond to appear before the next grand jury charged with larceny.

For some time past the Santa Fe company has been missing goods apparently stolen out of the cars and local merchants have also missed a considerable quantity of goods.

At last a clue was found when a glove belonging to one of the Wilson's was found near the plundered car and a package containing goods as ordered by the Kendall Dry Goods Company and which was never delivered to that concern, was found near the country home of the Wilsons.

This evidence coupled with the fact that some of the members of the family had figured in a petty larceny case some time previous, caused the officers to make an investigation of the premises and the subsequent arrest of the family, but prior to this a settler named Dodson residing in the neighborhood and who had missed a number of fence posts, became suspicious of the actions of the family and decided to institute a search on the Wilson claim for the missing posts, whereupon he was met by the 15 year old son Acy with a double barrel shot gun in hand and ordered to beat a hasty retreat which he proceeded to do without hesitancy.

When the officers with difficulty searched the premises, they discovered a considerable quantity of goods in a tent buried under some rubbish, and among it were the goods stolen from the car, the major portion of which was consigned to the Kendall Dry Goods Co. Several spools of barbed wire belonging to S. L. Brown and other articles recognized as the property of Clovis merchants was also unearthed. But the most sensational find was after the officers had removed a considerable quantity of goods which, judging from all stamps and marks came from Childress, Texas, they also uncovered a man who gave his name as George Cloud, although letters found in his pockets bore a different name.

After arresting this man and the other members of the family including the mother, who were brought to this city, the officers set out to hunt John and Jim, the two grown sons who were in town. They soon found John who was left to languish in the city bastille, and while they were searching for Jim some of John's friends appeared at the jail, pried the bars loose and let him out, so the search continues but the birds have flown.

In the examining trial held before Justice Adams Tuesday, all were placed under bond except Cloud, who, in default of bail, was sent to Portales jail for safe keeping.

One of the most mysterious murder cases in the history of this country was the finding of the dead body of Guy H. Porter at his home near Kirk Thursday, December 31st. He had been shot in the side with a shot gun, which was found near his dead body. Judge Hannum of this city, was notified and called a coroner's jury, which after viewing the remains and taking evidence brought in a verdict that Porter come to his death by being shot by Arthur Adams. Adams was immediately arrested and in his preliminary hearing the evidence against him was so strong that he was taken to Portales and lodged in jail to await his hearing on January 15th.

The deceased was about 30 years of age and was a man of exemplary habits and is highly spoken of by all who knew him. The remains were brought to this city where funeral services were held and interment made in the Melrose cemetery.
