## ORDINANCES

Of the Town of Portales, Roosevelt County, New Mexico. ORDINANCE NO. 3.
CITY OFFICERS-DUTIES AND POWERS.
Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the town of Por tales, New Mexico:- Section 1.- That each and every officer of the town of Portales whether elected or appointed shall, before entering en uon then the
duties of his office, take and subscribe an oath that he will well and truly perform all the duties of his ofice to the best of his skill and ability, and that he will support the constitution of the Unite shall be in the form prescribed by law.
Sec. 2. The officers of said town of Portales shall consist of five trustees one of whom shall be chairman, a town clerk, a town treasurer, a town attorney, a town marshal, a town physician, a
pound eeeper and a scavenger.
Sec. 3. There shall be nominated by the town trustees, at the first meeting after election of such board, or as soon thereafter a practicable, one chairman of the board of trustees, one town clerk one town treasurer, one town marshal, one town attorney and
one town physician, who shall hold their offices, respectively, for
the term of one (1) year, and until their successors shall be ap the term of one (1) year, and until their suc.
Sec. 4. The officers hereinafter mentioned shall, before enter ing upon the duties of their respective offices, execute bonds to the
town of Portales, with securitier to be approved by the board town of Portales, with securitier to be approved by the board
of trustees, conditioned that they will faithfuly perform the duties
of their respective offices, and thit the will, when they vacate of their respective offices, and that they will, when they vacate
their respective offices, surrender and turn over to their suceessors all moneys, books, papers, property and other things in their cus
tody or control belonging to the town. The penalties of the bonds as required by this section, shall be as follows:

For town clerk, the sum of one thousand dolars $(\$ 1,000.00$
For town treasurer, five thousand dollars For town marshal, twenty-five hundred dollars $(\$ 2,500.00)$
For town scavenger, two hundred and fifty dollars $(\$ 250.00)$
And the board of trustees may require a bond from any tow official and fix the amount therefor when, , in their jum anent, the
same is necessary. Said bonds shall be filed with the clerk of said soard, and by him be proserved and kept in some secure place

of trustees, and that of any tax payer of the town who shall de sire to examine the same, and shall be recorded in a book kept fo that purpose.

Sec. 5. The treasurer shall receive all moneys belonging to the ner as may be prescribed by ordinance, and such books and ac counts shall always be subject to the inspection of any member o
the board of trustees. He shall keep a separate account the board of trustees. He shall keep. a separate account o each fund or aparopriation and he debits or creaits beiongring
thereto. He shall give every person paying money into the treas ury a receipt therefor, specifying the date of payment and upon
what account paid, and he shall file statements of such recepts with the clerk at the date of each monthly report. He ehall, at the
end of each and every month, and oftener, if required, render an account to the board of trustees, or such officer as may be desig nated by ordinance, showing the state of the treasury. He sha also accompany such accounts with a statement of all moneys re-
ceived into the treasury, and upon what account, during the preceved intorthe togethery, with apol warrants redeemed and paid by him, which said warrants, with any and all vouchers held by him the clerk's office, upon every day of such statement. He, shall re curn all warrants paid by him stamped or marked "paid." He shail such warrants and show the date, amount, number, the fund from which paid, the name of the person to whom paid and when paid He may be required to keep all meneys in his hands belonging to
the corporation in such place of deposit as may be designated by the corporation in such pace of deposit as may be designated by
ordinance, provided however, no such ordinance shall he passed
by which the ustody of such money shall be taken from the treas. urer. The treasurer shall keep all moneys, belonging to the cor poration, in his hands separate and distinct from his own moneys, or indirectly, the corporation money or warrants in his dirdecty his own use or benefit, or that of any other person or persons,
whomsoover. Any violation of this provision shall subject him to immediate remova from once by ine varr ond astees, who ar his successor shall be appointed by the board of trustees and shal hold his office for the remainder of the unexpired term.

of all such receipts and expenditures, and all his transactions as such treasurer during the preceding fiscal year, which account the clerk shall immediately cause to be published in a newspaper printed in the town.
by the chairman of the board of trustees and countersigned by the clerk, stating the particular fund or appropriation to which the same be drawn except as hereinafter provided. All moneys reeeived on any special assessment shall be held by the treasurer as a special
fund to be applied to the payment of the improvement for which the assessment was made, and said money shall be used for no other purpose, whatever, unless to reimburse such corporation for money spent for such improvements.

The treasurer shall have and keep, in his office a book tered and set down every town warrant and the date of the pre sentation thereof, and without any interval of blank lines between any such entry and the one preceding it. Such registry of town warrants shal be open, at ail seasonable hourst to the inspectio of any person desiring to inspect or examine the same.
See 9. It shall be the duty of the town clerk to record al or that purpose. He shall countersign all warrants drawn upon the treasurer under the town seal. He shall make out all license under the town seal and before issuing any countersign the same shall present the same to the chairman of the board of wastee fo his signature and approval. He shall deep a full and complet record of all warrants and licenses issued, with the names of th parties in whose favor they are drawn, includinn dates, amounts nd numbers, and purposes for which given, and shall, on the first
day of each month, or as soon thereafter as the same can be com pleted, and at such other times as the board of trustees may re cuire, prepare a full and complete report of all warrants and lienses issued, also or all moneys collected belonging to the town month last preceding the said report, and shall submit the same to the board of trustees at its first regular meeting in each and ever month. The town clerk shall be the keeper of the town seal and

new county. The north line of new county. The north line of Curry county is a line in the
shape of a stair step. At the northwest corner it extends to towhship five north, one township into Quay county, thence east twelve miles, thence north six miles, thence east six miles, thence north six miles, thence east six miles, thence north six township 8 north 35 east, thence east to the Texas-New Mexico east
line.

The county seat is temporarily located at Clovis for one of county commissioners of Curry county shall call an election to vote on the location of the permanent county seat. The Governor of The Territory shall appoint the county officers of the new county on or before April 1st, 1909, these officers to serve till their successors' are elected at the next general election.
Curry county is authorized and
directed to issue directed to issue bonds to the amount of $\$ 29,000.00$, bearing dated July 1, 1909, cent, to be dated July 1, 190, payable absolutely thirty years after date, and offered for sale at not less than par. Out of the proceeds
of the bonds, $\$ 9,000.00$ shall be paid to Rooseveit county and $\$ 20$ 000.00 to Quay county, in full satisfaction of all claims of for county indebtedness in consideration of territory removed. If the bonds are not sold by January 1, 1910, then the bonds in amounts as stated above, with corupons attached shall be delivered to Roosevelt and Quay counties respectively in full satisfaction for said indebtedness. Curry county shall levy a tax to pay interest on these bonds, and

An ordinance providing for the licensin
Be to low by and New Mexico. Allise 1 board of trustees, and issued by the clerk, under his hand and the offifical seal of the corporation upon payment of his fees and the re ceipt for the sum provided and assessed by this ordinance for suc
license.
Sec. 2 The town clerk shall issue all licenses fixed by this ordinance. All licenses issued under section five of this ordinance shall be issued and dated on the first of each quarter, and the same
shall be due and payable on said date; for each part or fraction of a quarter. license shall be issued until the first of the next quarter Sec. 3. The town clerk shall deliver all licenses to the town marshal and charge him with the amount thereof; and the said marshal shall collect such amount and deposit the same within two days with the town treasurer, taking his receipt therefor, and such therewith. It shall be unlawful for any person to conduct, pursu or carry on, in the town of Portales, any occupation or business named in the following section withoil

Sec.5. All persons, firms or corporations shall be subject to and shall pay an annual license authorizing the pursuit or conduct ing or sucn occupacion, at ine rate and in the amout specined in the following schedule, to-wit:
