Farming Pocuibilities in Great Weat.
John L Cowan, one of the interesting writers on subjects concerning the great west, has writ ten an article relative to farming subjects in the semi-arid region ing excerpts:
"During the past two years 45,000 homestead entries have been filed upon the public lands of New Mexico alone-taking uy perhaps $6,500,000$ acres, adding probabiy 15,000 to the popula-
tion of the territory. In Westtion of the territory. In West
en Kansas and Nebraska, the Texas Panhandle, Eastern Colo Texas Panhandle, Eastern Colo-
rado and portions of Wyoming, rado and portions of Wyoming,
Montana and Idaho, the relative Montana and Idaho, the relative increase has been almost as great. markable "land rushes' in the narkabie tand rus.
"Dry farming in the semi-arid region is a success that admits of no denial. The exhibit of dry farmed crops made at the Dry Farming Congress at Cheyenne, Wyoming, February 23, 24, 25, could hardly have been beaten at an eastern fair or a southern irrigation congress. There are failures, of course-just as there are failures in every other industry, the world over. Last year there were many crop failures in New Mexico, Colorado and other So, also, were there many for, allures, were there many crop Pennsylvania and other states in which no one thinks of farming as a doubtful or harardous ung dertaking. Almost without exception, the failures in the plaine region were due to neglect or refusal to adopt farming methods in unalterable conditions. The men who take up homesteads anywhere in the Great Plains re gion, in any section in which lands for homesteading can be found today - with the intention of farming in the same manner that farming is conducted in the east, predetermine their own failure.
'The Great Plains region, between the 98th meridian and the Rocky mountains, is 300 miles wide (from east to west), and , 100 miles long, extending from 330,000 square miles, or 211 200 000 acres The avertye 000 acres. The average annual kion is from 16.6 inches in the northern portion to 20.9 inches in the southern. Just why there the southern. Just why ther to the possibilily of farming with this rainfall (the major part of which usually falls during the growing season), is a little difs ficult to understand. The San Joaquin valley of California has long been a famous wheat growing country, with an average annual rainfall of 12 or 13 inches. "In all semi-arid America, ex cepting the stretches of absolute desert, it would be difficult to find a region more unpromising, from an agricultural standpoint, than that inhabited by the Hopi, In dians of Arizona. came so wedged into the barrel that it was impossible to extract it with ordinary force. The result of these two main disadvantages was the in-
troduction of a new bayonet which when fixed still admitted of the fusil being fired. This new form was used in the Seottish war in 1689.
