Homeseekers should not take too much for granted. But there is reason to believe that there is in the aggregate a large acreage east of Denver which may be reclaimed by this means. It may easily exceed the entire area - two million acres-now under irrigation from ditches in this state.

"That the experiment may mean much for the future of Colorado and Denver is evident; for land irrigated from pumps calls for intensive cultivation, which in turn means great density of population.
