Be it ordained by the board of trustees of the les, New Mexico:
Section 1. That ordinance No. 5 be and the same is hereby anended as follows, to-wit: By striking out the figures " 75 ". after T25' and bis striking out after the said word circus the words "first
 parade ezs." and by striking out the words "sideshow with circus, ach per day $\$ 10$.
Passed and approved September 21, 1909 . Attest H. B. Ryther, Clerk.

ORDINANCE NO. 25. An ordinance providing for the search of suspicious places,
where intoxicating, malt, vinous or fermented liquoas are supposed to be stored for sale in violation of the ordinances of the town of Portaies, Nerdained by the board of rustees. Section 1. It shall be lawful for the justice of the peace of upon oath or affirmation, that any intoxicating, malt vino bere, mixe or fermented liquors have been stored in any housec or place within Said town, for sale in violation of ordinanee No. 4 of the town of
Portale, New Mexic. and that the person swearing. or affirming. does verily believe that such liquors are concealed within any issue a warrant under his hand commanding that such dweling
house, or other place be searched, and if any of the liquors described in any such warrant be found therein, then that the said the examination of witnesses before said justice of the peace, it shaill be determined by such justice of the peace that the said liquor sale in violation of this ordinance, such justice of the peace shall order the marshal of said town to publicly destroy any and all such liquors so found.
Sec. 2. The justice of the peace issuing such warrant shall have authority to subprona any witness, or witnesses, before him
for the purpoes of inpuiring into the storoe of any liquor, or ti-
quiors, found stored in violation of this ordinace the same authority to enforce obedience to any subpena so issued as is siven by chapter twenty-four of the compiled laws of the ter-
ritory of New Mexico, 1897. wec. 8. All ordinances'and parts of ordinances in conflict herewind effeet on and after the 19th day of October, 1999 .
Passed and approved this 5 th day of October. 1909.
