Denver wants our cantaloupes for he that means when Denver lay within an hours ride of severa of the largest cantaloupe produc ing regions of the United State and she is offering us fancy prices for our product which wil have to travel one day to reach of the southwest want our bean and sweet potatoes. They ar giving the secretary some fancy offers for early beans and for our fall crop of Jersey sweet potatoes. They not only want to handle the stuff for us but they say they have fancy trade which calls fo such products as the Portales val
ley produces. Of course Roswel ley produces. Of course Roswell is below us and raises great quan tities of this stuff but they do
not get rid of it in these fancy markets. They hold everythin until spring and then get rid of no better and yet the people no better and yet the peopie
used to go to Roswell and pass this place up. But they have at last decided that they have made a mistake and all those that ca in the valley and drifting this way, while the rest are stopping as they go through.
