



While the parole staff has remained constant, the parole rate has grown sharply and steadily. In 1957, the last year before professional parole supervision, the number of inmates paroled was 750. Following the establishment of a professional parole system, the parole rate climbed to 1,500 in 19-58; 1,800 in 1959, and will surpass 2,200 in 1960.

This increasing rate has made an important contribution to public safety because a parole system is basically directed toward the prevention of crime. For without any clemency of any kind 95 per cent of the 11,000 inmates now in prison will eventually serve their sentence and be released in the community, 80 per cent will be in society in less than 5 years, while more than 50 per cent will fully serve their sentence and walk the streets of our cities and towns in less than 2 years.
