



AP Feature Service Writer WASHINGTON, Nov. 21 .- Little boats that look like toys are playing the first important role n the development of Uncle Sam's bigger and better fleet.

These boats are tiny models of super - dreadnaughts, the speedy cruisers and the giant airplane carriers which are to be built under the billion dollar naval expansion program.
