Would Boost Arms Budget to Over Billion and Half

WASHINGTON, D. C., Jan. 2 (A).—President Roosevelt asked congress today for an immediate appropriation of \$525,000,000 as the "minimum of requirements" for bulwarking the nation's defense against the "possibiliies of present offense against the

In a special message the presilent requested that the amount be ppropriated at once to be divided etween the army and the navy.
