### Rogers and Evans to headline Tri-State Fair bill this year

Roy Rogers and Dale Evans, one of the most popular husband and wife teams in show business history, headline a large troupe of entertainers for nine performances at the 1969 Tri-State Fair, Sept. 15-20, in Amarillo.

INCLUDED in the star-studded fair are also the Steiner Brothers acrobatic team; the Sons of the Pioneers; Pat Brady of motion picture and TV fame; Chase & Park, acrobats; and Ben Smathers and the Stoney Mountain Cloggers, a square dancing sextet formerly featured at New York's Carnegie Hall.

Among free acts on an open-air stage is Gentle Ben, the 640-pound trained bear and star of the "Gentle Ben" TV series, who will perform the final three days of the six-day exposition.

Livestock and horse exhibitors, along with competitors in farm and home, art, culinary textile, china painting, photography and other events, will vie for a record \$46,000 in cash awards at this year's Tri-State Fair.

HORSES this year will show and perform in the new \$300,000 horse barn, sporting a 225 x 80-ft. indoor arena, 297 stalls, elaborate offices and display rooms. Additional stalls are available in the old horse barn.

Professional and non-professional cutting contests, approved by the American Quarter Horse Association and the National Cutting Horse Association, are expected to attract a record number of entries and spectators.

An all-youth horse show will draw hundreds of young competitors Saturday, Sept. 20, which also is Rural Youth Day.

Thirty-three bands from area high schools will provide music for the fair's opening day parade at

10 o'clock Monday morning, Sept. 15. This year marks the fair's 46th anniversary. It now is larger in exhibits and attendance than some state fairs.

### Pronghorn count about the same

The aerial census of the adult West Texas antelope population is complete, says Jack Parsons, wildlife supervisor for the Region I area.

IT SHOWS a slight increase in the Trans-Pecos and very light decreases in the Permian Basin and Panhandle.

Fawn counts are in progress and project leaders report early evidence of a good count in most areas except for a few isolated ranges affected by drought.

Dick DeArment, in the Panhandle, has come up with a very slight decrease. The tally for the area this year was 2,760 animals, only a token change from the previous year.

Tom Hailey, in the Trans-Pecos, tallied 7,523 adult animals, an increase of about 200 from last year. In the Permian Basin, George Litton estimates a slight decrease of about seven percent for a present total of approximately 2,085.

LAST YEAR'S season was a good one over most West Texas counties, and the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department expects very little change in hunting conditions and harvest.
