

Man, says the Scripture, is "fearfully and wonderfully made," but it seems as if government i still more so. The Byrd committee on congressional economy has uncovered no less than 1,141 buin the executive branch alone. Then there are 13 principal agencies in the executive office of the President, 23 emergency war agencies with 499 component parts, and 26 independent agencies with 265 component parts. Naturally there is a vast amount of milling around among all these organizations, with confusion and wasted effort.

It is largely the same old Topsy story. Things have not been planned that way, but have "just growed." With the ever-increasing complexity of a great government and a great country in a great world war, the tendency is to keep right on growing until the bureaucrats overwhelm the national scene, and nobody car find anybody else without a professional guide and an extensive leave of absence from his regular business.

The Byrd committee, at any rate, has rendered a public service by revealing the nature and scope of the job that has to be done. The beginning of wisdom in this case may be to stop hiring and start firing. Constitution of the State of Texis, amending Sections 51a, 51b 51c, and 51d of Article III so that the same shall consist of one section to be known as Section 51a providing that the Legislature shall have the power to provide assistance to and provide for the payment of same to actual bona fide citizens of Texas who are needy aged persons over the age of sixty-five (65) years, needy blind persons over the age of twenty-one (21) years, and needy children under the age of sixteen (16) years; providing for the acceptance of financial aid from the Government of the United States for such assistance; providing that the payments of such assistance from State funds shall never exceed either the payments from Federal funds or a total of more than Thirty-five Million Dollars (\$35,000,000) per year; providing for the necessary election, form of ballot, proclamation, and publication, and making an appropriation to defray the necessary expenses of proclamation, publication, and holding the election.

Be it Resolved by the Legislaure of the State of Texas:

Section 1. That Sections 51a 51b, 51c, and 51d of Article III of the Constitution of the State of Texas be amended and the same are hereby amended so that the same shall hereafter consist of one section to be numbered 51a, which shall read as follows:

"Sec. 51a. The Legislature shall have the power, by general laws to provide, subject to limitations and restrictions herein contained, and such other limitations, restrictions and regulations as may by the Legislature be deemed expedient for assistance to, and for the


